I am responding to your request under the Michigan Freedom of Information Act, received December 9, 2009 and extended to December 31, 2009. Your request for "all electronic communications, including but not limited to emails, sent to and from City Council members during the council meeting which began on January 18, 2005" is granted in part and denied in part. Your request is denied to the extent that the following redactions have occurred:

 Information of a personal nature if public disclosure of the information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of an individual's privacy. MCL 15.243(1)(a)

Your previous request of October 5, 2009 specifically asked for Council emails pertaining to 828 Greene Street or South Main Neighbors. Your current request is for all electronic communications sent to and from City Council members during the meeting, which are provided.

The City does not warrant or guarantee the accuracy of the information provided. Rather, it provides the documents only to comply in good faith with the Michigan Freedom of Information Act, and not for any other purpose.

If you receive written notice that your request has been denied, in whole or in part, under Section 10 of the Act, you may, at your option either: (1) submit to the City Administrator a written appeal that specifically states the word "appeal" and identifies the reason(s) for reversal of the disclosure denial; or (2) file a lawsuit in the circuit court to compel the City's disclosure of the record. If after judicial review, the circuit court determines that the City has not complied with the Act, you may be awarded reasonable attorneys' fees and damages as specified under the Act.

Your documents may be picked up in the Community Services Office (Sixth Floor, City Hall), Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

" This is an important first step to protect Michigan residents from chemicals found in mother's milk and likely to be dangerous to people, equot; said Tracey Easthope, Environmental Health Director of the Ecology Center. " These chemicals can damage the thyroid and impair the central nervous system, and viable alternatives exist for most uses." "Now that these bills are law, the Legislature should move swiftly to complete investigation of the "deca" form and phase it out if studies confirm it also can cause neurological damage, or breaks down in the environment into the other banned forms," said James Clift, Policy Director of the Michigan Environmental Council. "In order to protect public health, we need to switch quickly to alternative chemicals that do not pose the same health risks " risks." The following products usually contain the flame retardant: computers, television sets, mobile phones, electronics and electrical items, automotive equipment, construction materials, polyurethane foam mattresses, cushions, carpets, upholstered furniture, and draperies, among others. rurniture, and draperies, among others.
