## MICHIGAN QUICK HITS

### Television Coverage

The Michigan and Western Michigan game will be televised nationally by ESPN on ABC. Mike Patrick will handle the play-by-play with Craig James serving as the color analysts. Quint Kessenich will provide sideline reports and analysis.

### Radio Coverage

The Michigan Sports Network is comprised of 38 stations and the game can be heard on Sirius Satellite Radio. Frank Beckmann will handle the play-by-play with Jim Brandstatter serving as the color analyst and Doug Karsch providing sideline commentary.

### Season Openers

The Wolverines enter the season opener against Western Michigan with an impressive 106-20-3 record in their previous 129 openers. The Wolverines will play their 108th season opener at home this Saturday and hold a 90-15-2 mark in those games.

### Home Openers

The Wolverines have a 106-18-2 record all-time in home openers, including a 13-3 record at the "Big House" in the last 16 games. Michigan's only losses during that stretch came against Utah last year (25-23) Appalachian State in 2007 (34-32) and against Syracuse in 1998 (38-28).

## INSIDE MICHIGAN FOOTBALL

Inside Michigan Football, the University of Michigan Athletic Department-owned football show, begins its second season with head coach Rich Rodriguez, host Jim Brandstatter and reporter Doug Karsch.

Inside Michigan Football will be broadcast 15 times throughout the season, debuting on Thursday, Aug. 27, at 8 p.m. on Fox Sports Detroit, and Friday, Aug. 28, at 9 p.m. on the Big Ten Network. The weekly schedule will appear at noon and 7 p.m. every Thursday throughout the season on FS Detroit and will be broadcast nationally on the Big Ten Network Friday evenings at 5:30 p.m.

The show will include game highlights, player features, postgame locker room reactions, commentary from Rodriguez and a preview of the next opponent. Additional features such as sideline spotlights with former players, sounds of the game segments and more will be seen for the first time on Inside Michigan Football.

Due to Big Ten Network regulations, Inside Michigan Football will not be available on MGoBlue.com, but the U-M athletic department plans to offer a postgame internet wrap-up of each game called Michigan Rewind.

Michigan Rewind will be available on MGoBlue.com after each Michigan football game and will include eight to 10 minutes of highlights, analysis and interviews with coaches and players. In addition to Michigan Rewind, MGoBlue.com will offer interviews, features and special presentations throughout the week for Michigan football fans.

### Rodriguez in Season Openers

- This will be Rodriguez's 17th season opener as a head coach.
- Coach Rod has posted an 8-7-1 record in his 16 previous season openers.
- Rodriguez lost his Michigan coaching debut, a 25-23 affair to Utah, an eventual undefeated team and Sugar Bowl Champion, in the 2008 opener.
- He posted a 5-2 record in seven openers as West Virginia coach (4-1 home, 1-1 road), including victories in his final four season opener with the Mountaineers.
- Rodriguez posted a 3-3-1 mark in openers at Glenville State and lost in his only opener as head coach at Salem College.

### Michigan Against the MAC

- Compiled an impressive 24-1 record against teams currently from the Mid-American Conference.
- U-M has outscored those schools by an 838-226 margin in those 25 games.
- All 25 of the games against MAC schools have been played at Michigan Stadium.
- This is the 10th consecutive year that Michigan has matched up with a MAC school.
- U-M earned its first victory of the Rich Rodriguez era with a 16-6 win over Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 6, 2008.

### Rodriguez vs. Non-Conference

- Rich Rodriguez is 1-3 in non-conference games as Michigan head coach.
- Rodriguez posted an impressive 25-8 record against regular-season non-conference opponents at WVU.
- He had a 10-game winning streak in non-conference tilts snapped with the loss to Utah in his Michigan debut.
- He has wins in 19 of his last 24 non-conference games during the regular season.

### Morrison Returns as WMU Coordinator

Former Wolverine linebacker Steve Morrison, a rare five-year letterman, returns to Ann Arbor as the defensive coordinator for the Broncos. He is in his second season as defensive coordinator for WMU and fifth as the linebackers coach. Morrison holds the Michigan Stadium record for most tackles in a game, racking up 23 stops against Illinois on Nov. 14, 1992.

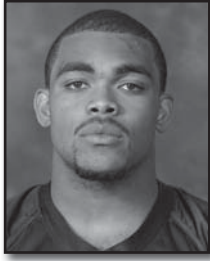

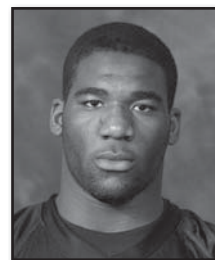

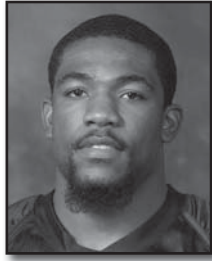

### Michigan Stadium -- 1927-2009 (83 Years)

The Wolverine football program is in its 83rd season in the "Big House" in 2009, with a 375-114-15 all-time record at Michigan Stadium. The largest college football stadium in the country, it was completed in 1927 at a cost of \$950,000, initially seating 72,000 fans. Michigan won the first game played at Michigan Stadium, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0, on Oct. 1, 1927. The stadium was officially dedicated on Oct. 22, 1927, with a 21-0 shutout over Ohio State.

Since that inaugural season, the capacity of Michigan Stadium has increased eight times to its present 106,201. The Wolverines have led the nation in attendance 33 times in the past 34 years, and reestablished the NCAA single-game attendance record at 112,118 fans during the 2003 Ohio State game.

The Wolverines have drawn crowds of 100,000-plus for 215 consecutive games. On football Saturdays in Ann Arbor, Michigan Stadium ranks as the fourth-largest "city" in the state of Michigan, surpassing the population of Ann Arbor itself.

Michigan Stadium was the only college-owned football facility with a video scoreboard above both end zones. It was also the first stadium to use electronic scoreboards for official time when, in 1930, two were installed.

**CAPACITY:** 106,201—the largest college-owned structures of its kind designed solely for football—closer to the playing field with no running track—no posts or other obstructions.

**COMPLETION:** 1927—at a cost in excess of \$950,000 to seat 72,000 spectators. Capacity raised to 84,401 by addition of temporary wooden bleachers until 1949 when permanent steel stands replaced the wooden bleachers, increasing the capacity to 97,239. Seating capacity then raised to 101,001 in 1956, 101,701 in 1973, 102,501 in 1992 and 107,501 in 1998.

**FIRST GAME:** October 1, 1927—Michigan led by Captain Bennie Oosterbaan, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 33-0. LaVerne (Kip) Taylor, Michigan end, scored first in the stadium on a 28-yard pass from halfback Louis Gilbert.

**DEDICATION GAME:** October 22, 1927—Michigan defeated Ohio State, 21-0.

**ATTENDANCE:** Since 1927—42,063,000 fans have watched the Wolverines play 504 games (an average of 83,458). Stadium attendance record of 106,982 set Nov. 22, 1997 against Ohio State. Since expansion of the "Big House" in 1998, the single-game attendance record is 112,118 set against Ohio State on Nov. 22, 2003. NCAA season record of 745,139 set in 1997.

**FIELD:** 360 x 160 feet—Installed FieldTurf in 2003, returning Michigan to an artificial surface for the first time since the 1990 season.

Installed Prescription Athletic Turf in 1991, giving Michigan its first natural grass field since 1968. Field was also lowered 3-1/2 feet allowing better sightlines for those seated in the lower rows.

### 215 Straight

The University of Michigan football team has played 215 consecutive home games in front of crowds in excess of 100,000. The last time Michigan did not have 100,000 in attendance in Michigan Stadium was on Oct. 25, 1975 vs. Indiana. A crowd of 93,857 was on hand for the 55-7 Michigan victory.

Since then, Michigan has set numerous NCAA attendance marks and the Wolverines have led the nation for 33 of the past 34 seasons in attendance.

# HEAD COACH RICH RODRIGUEZ



## Rich Rodriguez: Head Coach ■ West Virginia (1986)

**Michigan W-L: 3-9 (.250) Second Season**

**Big Ten W-L: 2-6 (.250)**

Rich Rodriguez is in his second season as head coach of the nation's all-time winningest football program. Rodriguez was announced as the 18th head coach in U-M football history on Dec. 17, 2007. He is just the 11th head coach in the 107 years since Fielding H. Yost made his debut in 1901.

Rodriguez arrived at Michigan after spending seven years as head coach at West Virginia University where he led the Mountaineers to a 60-26 record, four Big East titles and six consecutive bowl game bids. In 2005, he was named to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Following a 10-2 (5-2 Big East) season in 2007 in which his team won the Big East title and a BCS berth, Rodriguez was named the AFCA Region I co-Coach of the Year, sharing the honor with Boston College's Jeff Jagodzinski. It was Rodriguez's second such honor after being recognized by the AFCA in 2003. He was a finalist for the 2007 Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award, which honors the college football coaches who best exemplify responsibility and excellence on and off the field. Rodriguez was also the 2003 and 2005 Big East Coach of the Year.

Under Rodriguez's guidance, WVU claimed four Big East championships in five years (2003, '04, '05, '07) and recorded three consecutive seasons (2005-07) with double-digit victories for the first time in school history. The Mountaineers recorded at least eight wins in each of his last six seasons, and from 2002-07, accumulated a record of 57-16, winning 78.1 percent of their games.

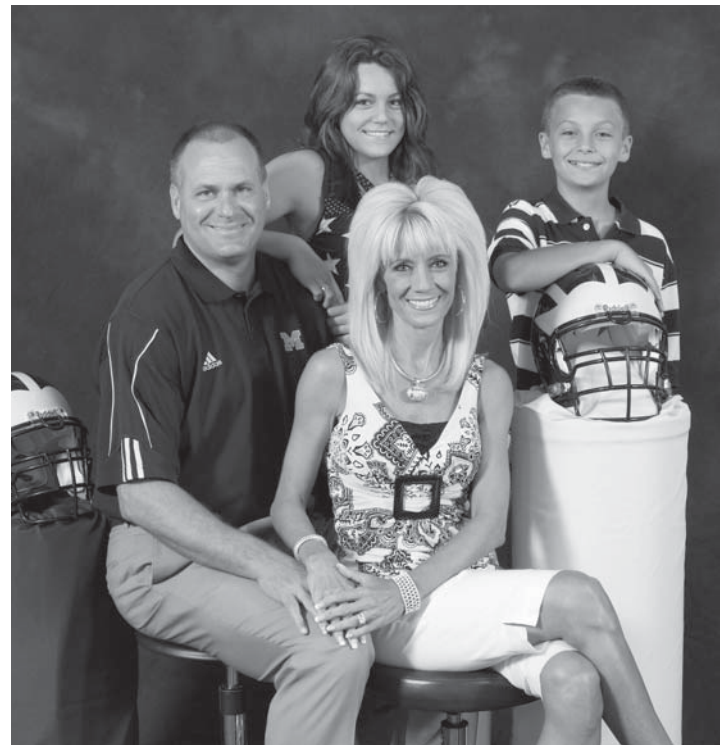
In 2006, the Mountaineers finished 10th in the national polls at 11-2 behind a pair of All-Americans and the Big East Player of the Year. In 2004 and 2005, Rodriguez's teams claimed conference titles, as the 2005 squad went on to record WVU's first BCS victory, a 38-35 upset over Georgia in the Sugar Bowl.

The Mountaineers rattled off seven straight wins in 2003 to post a 6-1 mark in conference play and tie Miami for the Big East title, while earning a second straight bowl berth. In 2002, Rodriguez engineered the greatest turn-around in Big East history, taking his 2001 team from a 1-6 record in league play to 6-1 the following year. West Virginia finished second in the nation in rushing in 2002 (283 ypg) and ranked

fourth nationally in turnover margin.

Prior to accepting the West Virginia job on Nov. 26, 2000, Rodriguez served as offensive coordinator and associate head coach for Tommy Bowden at Clemson in 1999 (6-6) and 2000 (9-3). He spent the previous two years, 1997 and '98, as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for Bowden at Tulane where he helped lead the Green Wave to a 19-4 mark. After a 7-4 record in 1997, Rodriguez helped Tulane post an undefeated 1998 season (12-0) with the Conference USA championship and a victory over Brigham Young in the Liberty Bowl.

Rodriguez began his collegiate head coaching career at the NAIA/Division II level at Salem (1988) and Glenville State College (1990-96). In between both head coaching stops, Rodriguez was a volunteer assistant coach for the Mountaineers' outside linebackers in 1989.

At Glenville State, his teams won or shared four consecutive West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference titles (1993-96). Rodriguez was named the WVIAC Coach of the Year in 1993 and '94, as well as the NAIA Coach of the Year after leading his 1993 team to a national runner-up finish. He was also recognized by the West Virginia Sports Writers Association as the state College Coach of the Year for all sports in 1993. Rodriguez led the Pioneers to the national playoffs twice and posted a 43-28-2 record during his seven seasons. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Rodriguez served as Glenville's athletic director in 1995-96, and was inducted into the Glenville Hall of Fame in 2003.

Rodriguez's players set five national career records for Division II. Three Pioneers received the WVIAC Player of the Year honors in succession: Jed Drenning in 1992-93, Chris George in 1994 and Scott Otis in 1995.

The secondary coach and special teams coordinator at Salem International University (now Salem College) in 1986, Rodriguez was then promoted to assistant head coach and defensive coordinator for the 1987 season. He became the youngest college football head coach in the country at 24 when Salem appointed him in 1988. He posted a 2-8 record during his first season as head coach. Unfortunately, Rodriguez's tenure didn't last long as the school was bought out one year later and the football program was dissolved prior to the 1989 season.

A member of West Virginia's 1981-84 teams, Rodriguez was a three-year letterwinner (1982-84) as a defensive back for Don Nehlen; Nehlen served as an assistant coach at U-M for Bo Schembechler from 1977-79. The Mountaineers posted a 26-10 record in those three years and made three bowl appearances: the 1982 Gator Bowl (lost to Florida State, 31-12); the 1983 Hall of Fame Bowl (defeated Kentucky, 20-16); and the 1984 Bluebonnet Bowl (defeated TCU, 31-14).

Rodriguez earned a bachelor's degree in physical education and safety from West Virginia in 1986, and added a master's degree in physical education from Salem in 1987.

A native of Grant Town, W.Va., in Marion County, Rodriguez grew up just five miles from the birthplace of U-M legendary coach Fielding Yost (Fairview, W.Va.). He is a 1981 graduate of North Marion High School, where he was a four-sport letterman and an all-state honoree in football and basketball, leading the Huskies to the 1980 Class AAA state football championship.

Rich and his wife, Rita, have two children, Raquel and Rhett.

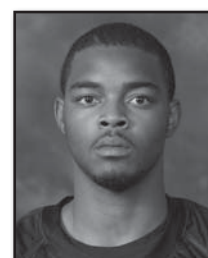
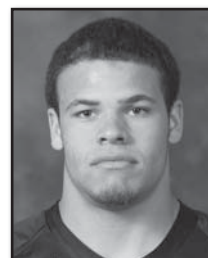

# WOLVERINE FACTS

## MICHIGAN TRADITION

---

- U-M is in its 130th year on the gridiron.
- Michigan ranks first all-time in Division 1-A wins with 872.
- The Wolverines rank first in all-time all-division wins with 872.
- Michigan ranks first in all-time winning percentage (.739817).
- U-M is the winningest overall athletic program in Big Ten Conference history.
- Michigan has 394 television appearances, the most of any college football program in NCAA history.
- U-M has compiled a 260-126-8 record when appearing on television.
- Michigan has appeared in 169 consecutive televised games.
- Michigan's 42 Big Ten Conference titles are the most of any college football program in any conference.
- U-M is fifth all-time with 11 national titles: 1901, 1902, 1903, 1904, 1918, 1923, 1932, 1933, 1947, 1948, 1997.
- The Wolverines' 11 national championships are more than any other Big Ten school and ranks fifth all-time in college football history.
- Michigan lists fourth all-time in NCAA history with 76 consensus All-American selections.
- The Wolverines have had 124 players earn first-team All-America honors during their careers.
- Three Michigan players – Tom Harmon, Desmond Howard, Charles Woodson – have won the Heisman Memorial Trophy. A total of 23 other Wolverines have placed among the top 10 in the voting.
- Michigan has an overall all-time record of 872-295-36 (.739817).
- Michigan's famed winged helmet is the most recognizable symbol in college football.

## MICHIGAN STADIUM

---

- Michigan Stadium is in its 82nd season as the home of U-M football.
- The Wolverines have won 33 of their last 42 games at Michigan Stadium.
- U-M has drawn in excess of 100,000-plus fans to 215 consecutive home games (1975 to current).
- U-M has led the nation in attendance 33 of the last 34 seasons.
- 42,063,000 fans have watched the Wolverines over the years at Michigan Stadium.
- Michigan has compiled a 375-114-15 record at Michigan Stadium.
- The Wolverines have had 72 winning seasons in 82 years at Michigan Stadium.
- Michigan has the second largest college-owned stadium with a capacity of 106,201.
- Michigan's largest stadium crowd was 112,118 in 2003 vs. Ohio State, the NCAA regular-season record.
- "The Big House" -- The nickname for Michigan Stadium coined by legendary college football announcer Keith Jackson. U-M was the first school to have a line of apparel named after its stadium's nickname.

## BOWL HISTORY

---

- The Wolverines' streak of 33 straight bowl games is the second longest in NCAA history.
- Michigan ranks ninth in NCAA history with 39 all-time bowl appearances.
- U-M is tied for 11th in all-time bowl victories (19).
- Michigan has appeared in more Rose Bowls (20) than any other Big Ten Conference school.
- The Wolverines have won four consecutive bowl games on two different occasions.
- Michigan has appeared 27 times on Jan. 1 or Jan. 2 since 1975, the year the Big Ten allowed more than just the champion to go to bowls.
- U-M has played 33 of its 39 bowl games in January.
- The Wolverines streak of nine consecutive Jan. 1 bowl appearances from the 1997 through 2004 seasons was the fifth longest in NCAA history.
- U-M beat Stanford 49-0 on Jan. 1, 1902, to win the first-ever Rose Bowl.
- Michigan has an overall bowl record of 19-20.

## NATIONAL POLLS

---

- The Wolverines have the most weekly appearances in the AP poll, appearing 748 times since 1936.
- Since the preseason 1988 poll, U-M has been ranked in every poll but three in 1993, four in 1998, four in 2005, nine in 2007 and 13 in 2008.
- U-M ranks No. 1 all-time in composite AP final football polls (1936-2008).
- The Wolverines have finished in the top 10 of the AP poll 37 times since its inception in 1936.
- U-M finished second in the 1985 final AP poll, and has been ranked 15 times in the top 5 nationally when the final poll was released.
- Michigan has finished in the final top 25 rankings 55 times since the inception of the AP poll in 1936.
- Michigan has been ranked in the final Associated Press top 25 poll 22 of the past 23 years and 37 of the last 40 years (was not ranked in 1984 and did not receive a final AP ranking in 1982 and 2005).

## BIG TEN CONFERENCE

---

- U-M ranks first in all-time Big Ten football titles with 42.
- The Michigan football program is the only Big Ten team in any sport to win a conference title in each decade.
- Michigan has won or shared 20 Big Ten titles since 1969, including three conference crowns in the 2000s.
- The Wolverines have had 270 players named All-Big Ten Conference first team a total of 388 times, the most of any conference school.
- U-M players have earned 44 All-Big Ten first team honors since 2000.
- At least one Michigan player has received All-Big Ten first team honors each of the past 45 seasons and 87 out of the 97 years that the school has been associated with the conference.
- The Wolverines have received 97 Player of the Week honors since the conference began handing out the award in 1987.
- Four U-M players have been named Big Ten Freshman of the Year.
- Michigan's 15 Chicago Tribune Big Ten Most Valuable Player Awards are the most of any team in the conference.
- Michigan has won 39 of its last 41 Big Ten openers.
- U-M has a record of 463-172-18 vs. Big Ten opponents.

## WOLVERINES IN THE NFL

---

- U-M had 56 former players in 2008 NFL Training Camps.
- Michigan has placed 286 former players onto NFL rosters.
- Michigan players have been selected in 70 consecutive National Football League Player Selection Meetings (draft).
- U-M lists tied for fifth all-time with 43 first-round NFL draft picks.
- A total of 11 Michigan players have been selected in the top 10 of the NFL Draft.
- A total of 45 former U-M players have made 65 Super Bowl appearances.
- Tom Brady, Ty Law, Jim Mandich and Bubba Paris have each claimed three Super Bowl championship rings during their careers.
- Two Wolverines have been selected Super Bowl MVPs: Desmond Howard and Tom Brady (twice).
- Wolverines have made 79 appearances in the NFL Pro Bowl, including a school record four players in 2001 and 2005.
- Seven former Wolverines have been enshrined in the NFL Hall of Fame: Benny Friedman, George Allen, Tom Mack, Dan Dierdorf, Len Ford, Bill Hewitt and Elroy Hirsch. U-M ranks third among colleges with seven NFL Hall of Famers.
