I sent the following letter January 25, never received a reply. On February 1st when I next visited, nothing had been done to fix the situation, in fact it was worse. Today, February 8, visited again, with my mother -- who uses a walker; in spite of recent snowmelt, she could not get around the ice blockade.

This is a deliberate hazard to the handicapped -- and on city property no less. Neither Community Standards nor the Police can be bothered to do anything about it. Winter may be waning, and we may or may not have more snow this season, but I expect better treatment for the handicapped than this and I won't forget about it next year.

The most galling thing about this, besides it being city property, is that the non-handicapped parking spots are all clear and dry, but the handicapper spots and curb-cut are used to dump the wast snow.

I visited Kerrytown Sunday, January 25, 2009, at 1:00 PM.

In the city owned parking lot on the south-side (Farmer's Market) near Kosmo's and Hollanders, there are two handicapped parking spaces and a curb-cut for wheelchairs and walkers; these were blocked with snow and ice that were deliberately plowed there. I mentioned this to a merchant at Kerrytown, but it is city property, and not really their responsibility, especially as the city does collect parking fees on that site.

The city should clean it up, and make sure it stays that way. Considering the recent A2 News article, this is a maddening oversight.

Hi Carsten,

Staff is in the process of gathering information on the status of the project including permitting. I hope to give you a more comprehensive answer early next week.

The church received site plan approval (administrative amendment approved on 6-9-08) to construct a 3 story, 28,000 square foot building on the west side of the site. The existing parking lot on the east side of the site (abutting the Brooks Street properties) is proposed to be resurfaced but not expanded. An underground detention system is proposed immediately south of the existing church). The new building is proposed to be located more than 300-feet from the rear property lines of the Brooks Street homes.

The existing TCO is simply a "patient loading / unloading" zone with a 15 minute limit for 24/7. There were some previous versions with passenger loading zones with 30 minute limits and problems with people parking in the zone (per the UM) were encountered.

In general the passenger loading / unloading zones and the commercial loading zones are for all time periods. The only exceptions that come to mind are one near the church at Maynard/William which excludes Sunday, and at some school sites. From a practical standpoint it would be hard to create / post a sign and have it understood with various hours (as described in the letter). This is the case at Bach elementary where confusion has arose over parking during non peak times with variable pick up /drop off times. Additionally the idea was brought up in front of the YMCA site and dismissed as too confusing.

I would propose excluding Sundays from the zone as they do not operate at all on Sundays and it a clear, simple message to sign.





The most galling thing about this, besides it being city property, is that the non-handicapped parking spots are all clear and dry, but the handicapper spots and curb-cut are used to dump the wast snow.

The existing TCO is simply a "patient loading / unloading" zone with a 15 minute limit for 24/7. There were some previous versions with passenger loading zones with 30 minute limits and problems with people parking in the zone (per the UM) were encountered.

In general the passenger loading / unloading zones and the commercial loading zones are for all time periods. The only exceptions that come to mind are one near the church at Maynard/ William which excludes Sunday, and at some school sites. From a practical standpoint it would be hard to create / post a sign and have it understood with various hours (as described in the letter). This is the case at Bach elementary where confusion has arose over parking during non peak times with variable pick up /drop off times. Additionally the idea was brought up in front of the YMCA site and dismissed as too confusing.

I would propose excluding Sundays from the zone as they do not operate at all on Sundays and it a clear, simple message to sign.

The City of Ann Arbor has contracted with the Davey Resource Group (DRG), a Division of the Davey Tree Expert Company to complete an inventory of city-owned street and park trees. They will be plotting the location of the trees using global positioning equipment, and assessing tree species, size, and condition of city-owned street and park trees. They will not be doing any assessments on private property.

All workers will be wearing clothing and yellow safety vests with the Davey name/logo. I have provided a letter authorizing their work that each worker will be carrying. They will also have signs that will be in their parked vehicles stating they are doing a tree inventory and providing my contact information. The work being performed by DRG was approved by City Council at their January 20, 2009 meeting.

The inventory work will begin today, February 9 and will be completed around June 30, 2009. Their hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and will include Saturdays.

Typically there will be 4 DRG workers, but there may be times when there will be additional staff on site. Here is a list of DRG staff that may be working on the project.

#### PARKING GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORIZED EMPLOYEES

Effective March 1, 2009, parking permits will be issued to City staff on a case-by-case basis depending on the following criteria:

- 1) Permanent office location
- 2) Use of personal or city vehicle for city business
- 3) Frequency of off-site appointments required to conduct city business.

Distribution and approval of parking permits will be under the direction of the Public Services Administrator.

The following identify how the Employee Parking Permit program will operate. The overall effectiveness of the program will depend on the consistent parking enforcement of rules and regulations established below.

Vehicles must display a valid hang tag or parking permit during the hours of operation or be subject to enforcement.

Parking agreement must be updated to reflect information for the driver, vehicle, and service unit. Permit holders are required to comply with the terms of the agreement. Violation or abuse of the terms of the parking agreement may result in termination of parking privileges.

Parking permits and hang tags are valid only in your designated parking area. YOU MAY NOT PARK IN ANY OTHER LOCATIONS.

#### City Hall Parking

Beginning January 1, 2009, the Clerk's Office will no longer issue City Hall parking passes to City staff, Board and Commission members, City vendors, Police and Poll worker, volunteers or individuals attending city meetings. Please encourage visitors to use designated public parking areas or parking structures at Ann & Ashley or Washington & Fourth at their own expense. Loading areas are designated for short term vendor deliveries etc.

### **Permanent Permits**

These permits are full-day parking hangtags and are assigned to Lots #6 and Lot #7. Please remember - Park no wider than 7ft from the curb and do not block driveways.

### 18-Month Permit Holders

If you are issued an 18-month permit, this permit will allow you to park in a permit designated area on Ann St. for a period of 18 months. This area will be known as Lot #7 and will be indicated with appropriate signage. Your permit will be valid from March 1, 2009 — August 31, 2010. After 18 months, this permit space will no longer be available for your use. Other parking options that may be available to you include the Ann Ashley parking structure. For more information on this option, contact payroll. Additional transportation choices include a free Go Pass for travel on AATA buses, or other commuting opportunities are detailed at <a href="https://www.getdowntown.org">www.getdowntown.org</a>.

### **Timed Parking**

The timed parking permit can be used in any personal or city vehicle to park in timed permit-designated spaces for less than two hour on Ann Street.


Timed parking will also be available for four hours or less at the Ann Ashley parking structure using one of these permits with an automatic reader cards (AVR), which will be issued on a one-time basis at \$30 charge per issued card. This will be billed directly to your service unit. The \$30 charge will also be billed for any lost or damaged cards. Unit Managers are responsible for managing usage and must monitor a monthly report to ensure that all employees are parking in the structure for four hours or less.

The automatic reader cards will only allow access Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 5:30pm.

If you have city business beyond the four hour limit, please pay the hourly rate in the structure and discuss reimbursement procedures with your supervisor.

### **Handicap Permits**

These permits will be issued in coordination with Human Resources. Handicap designated parking will be provided to employees who qualify for special accommodations. Employees issued handicap parking permits will be required to pay their portion of the DDA parking structure fees.

I am sorry to read that you are not satisfied with the swift, responsive action taken by Messers Cawley and Pirooz after your quite reasonable suggestion to reduce parking restrictions at Fletcher Street.

I was even more sorry, however, to have the professionalism and good faith of City Staff questioned without justification. It does not condescend to the public to suggest that a City sign might be confusing. It does not express contempt to the public to draw an analogy from Bach and the YMCA sites (referenced in Mr. Cawley's email) and conclude that that experience might be relevant here.

From my vantage point, you brought a legitimate issue to the City's attention, Staff took your request, promptly investigated the facts on the ground, and analyzed the situation using their considerable relevant education and traffic/parking management experience. In view of these considerations they agreed that your observation had merit and so pledged to make a swift, responsive change. You believe that that proposed change is not entirely satisfactory. That is naturally your right and for all I know you may be correct. It may be that such a sign as you suggest would prove more beneficial in the aggregate than the sign proposed by Staff — it may be that the aggregate Good of the extra parking provided might outweigh the confusion associated with atypical weekday-specific signage. But be that as it may, you have not demonstrated any just cause to impugn the good faith of City Staff for coming to a conclusion that differs from your own.

# DRAFT Germantown Neighborhood Outreach Strategy January 29, 2009

The following is a strategy designed to gauge neighborhood interest in the development of a Germantown Historic District.

#### 1. Hold Two Neighborhood Meetings

Notify residents within the neighborhood area defined on the attached map. Notice for these meetings would be via: direct mailing to residents and property owners in the neighborhood (162 properties with 560 addresses), direct email to stakeholders; posting on the City webpage; notification via GovDelivery; advertising on CTN; and other methods as needed. Note: there are no neighborhood associations in this area.

## Neighborhood Meeting (Meeting 1)

This will be a workshop format, and is expected to last 2 to 3 hours. The meeting could be held either in the downtown library or adjacent church.

- □ Introduction—describe the purpose of the meeting and involvement opportunities.
- Planning Framework—describe the Central Area Plan and R4C zoning as it relates to the neighborhood.
- Historic District—define components of a historic district including designations, local district components, the Secretary of Interior's Standards and Guidelines, and other frequently asked questions.
- Discussion—encourage participants to evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of a Germantown Historic District. Participants also discuss what they value about their neighborhood and what needs strengthening. Staff is available to answer questions and facilitate discussion.
- Paper Survey—distribute a one page survey to all participants. The survey is designed to gauge interest in a historic district. Basic profile information is also collected such as where the participant lives (within or outside the neighborhood), do they own their home or are they renters, age range, etc. Space on the survey will be available for additional comments and ample time will be given to complete the survey at the meeting.
- Closing—collect the survey and describe next steps.

#### Report Back (Meeting 2)

Reconvene with participants at a follow-up meeting no more than two weeks after the first neighborhood meeting. This meeting will be one and half hours in length. Staff will present a draft summary of the discussion and survey results from the first meeting.

#### 2. Report Findings to City Council

This would include documentation of the two neighborhood meetings and survey results.

This entire process could be completed in April and May 2009 or September and October 2009. Summer is not the preferred time to schedule the neighborhood meetings.



Dear Mr. Mayor and City Council members:

When the City began charging for commercial trash pickup, the initial rate quoted was about \$80/month (for a 6 yd container). This was more than commercial haulers charged, so we had the containers we owned hauled away from our City of Ann Arbor locations, and we signed a contract with Waste Management for about \$60/month per location. Within months, the City (realizing its mistake? responding to complaints?) cut its rate about in half, leaving us in the situation of paying about 50% more than we would have had we kept our dumpsters and stayed with City service. At \$20/month more for four City locations, that has been costing us at least \$80/month ever since. (And I'll admit that I've been doing a slow burn as I've paid every one of those bills).

Now that our contracts with Waste Management have expired, we decided to bite the bullet and start switching back to City service. We saw this as a calculated risk because the cost of purchasing a 6 yard dumpster is about \$1200, which would mean a two year payback before realizing any savings (using the figures of \$40/month for City service and \$90/month for Waste Management). Still, last year we went ahead and purchased a dumpster for one of our locations and switched service back to the City.

Today I started to look into switching service at other locations and learned that the City will very likely give Waste Management a contract for its commercial trash hauling, and that WM will provide the dumpsters at no charge. Of course, this means that we just wasted hundreds of dollars purchasing a new dumpster, but if what Tom McMurtrie told me today is true, it is also true that the City's new charge for servicing a 6 yard dumpster will be HIGHER than what I am currently paying Waste Management. As the attached bills show, the proposed \$100/month charge would be more than 10% higher than what WM currently charges us, and a whopping 150% higher than the City's current charge.

I realize times are hard, the cost of managing waste continually increases, and the City needs to cut services to match the loss of revenue, but it seems to me that gaining a contract the size of the one WM would get from the City would mean that they could charge LESS than they currently charge their customers, not more. So, since it is looking like the City will be dropping this service

to business taxpayers, I would like to request that the City Council at least negotiate a price with the new provider—whichever company that may be—which is not more than the market rate.

I was primarily responsible for the drafting of this resolution, and I just wanted to say how greatly appreciative we are to you for noticing the two mistakes within the resolution. We have removed those items. I am by no means a legal expert, and so I must have misinterpreted what I read about these two areas of law. If there are any other problematic legal items within this resolution, please let me know. We truly appreciate your legal expertise. I am attaching the revised resolution—we included the townships within this version of the resolution. We are also working on having it reviewed for legal problems by Maurice Emsellem, an attorney with the National Employment Law Project who has supported cities/counties across the country with the passage of their resolutions/ordinances. We may have already sent this link to you from NELP's website, but it includes summaries of and links to similar resolutions/ordinances across the country:

Much of the language from our resolution was adapted from the resolutions of Minneapolis and Boston.

Miriam Aukerman (<u>maukerman@legalaidwestmich.net</u>), an attorney with Western Legal Aid who is very knowledgeable on prisoner reentry issues, is also aware of our resolution and would be willing to help with any of the drafting process if you or any of the other elected officials would like her input. ### Megan-

Thank you for sending this information to me. As Councilmember Teall may have communicated, I am supportive of this concept. I think it's important, however, to make sure the details are carefully worked out. Our City Administrator is confident we can put something together that respects the importance of safety/security for certain positions while providing opportunities for people returning from the Corrections system.

I have two concerns about the text of the resolution:

The 8th Whereas clause reads: WHEREAS, Article I, Section 26 of the Michigan Constitution is committed to equal employment opportunities for all persons.

Unfortunately, Article I, Section 26 says no such thing. Article I, Section 26, subsection 2 addresses a very specific set of characteristics, such as race, sex, etc. It does not cover "all persons." Moreover, subsection 1 actually bans affirmative action programs.

The 9th Whereas clause reads: WHEREAS, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 forbids employers from disqualifying applicants based on criminal convictions that are not job-related

Again, Title VII says no such thing. With all due respect, this is a completely inaccurate statement. Moreover, no Court in Michigan or the 6th Circuit has ever held that Title VII prohibits making employment decisions based on criminal convictions. The footnote supporting that whereas clause cites to a newsletter that discusses ways to encourage hiring of persons with criminal convictions; that is far different than the language as currently written in this Whereas clause.

I think it's vitally important that any resolution passed by a governmental entity not misrepresent the law. Accordingly, I urge you to revise or strike those provisions from the resolution. Our Attorney would never allow such language to appear in a resolution.

Thanks so much for taking a lead and working so hard on this. I'll look for an e-mail soon about a revised

There were a number of suggestions received on groups that need to be represented on the advisory committee.

Several options to think about:

- 1. I was in a class and the discussion of fire departments' billing private ambulance agencies came up. The instructor stated that it could not be worded as "billing" but, would need to be stated as a "service fee". I will discuss the "wording" with Ed this morning.
- 2. HVA has an exchange system with us for basic medical supplies used on scene. We could bargain that they purchase all of our medical equipment. Such as big ticket items used again and again, i.e... new suction units. \$400.00 a piece X 10= \$4000.00 we have many items that need replacing and they could supply us with these big ticket items.
- 3. Currently, I teach EMS continuing-ed credits to our firefighters. HVA could come in once a month and teach advanced level care for us. This would offer our firefighters additional practical credits at a higher level of learning. This is worth about \$60.00 to \$70.00 an hour depending on where you go. \$60.00 an hour 2 times a day, 3 times a week, 12 times a year = \$4320.00

These are alternative ways to re-coup costs without actually "billing". Chief Hopkins and/or Tom Crawford would need to negotiate this concept with HVA. Overall, if we could capture items 2 and 3 we could be recovering EASILY over \$10,000 a year.

This letter is in regards to the multiple attempts that we have made to resolve the sidewalk repairs issues. On February 2, 2009, we received a letter dated January 31, 2009 from the City of Ann Arbor. This letter made no r eference to the original letter that had been sent to them. In fact, not one of our concerns was addressed. This letter was not our first attempt to resolve this issue; we spoke to a Ms. Susan McCormick's Assistant back in November. She was informed that we felt it was unwarranted to pay the administration fees; at this point the repair fee had already been paid. We never received a response.

To reiterate the situation at hand, the sidewalk repair issues began on June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2008. The workers began to cut out the sidewalk blocks, they were immediately asked to stop. At this point several other residents began to gather around and also asked them to stop. Not one of the residents of Second St. had been notified of any sidewalk repairs that were going to take place on this date. The supervisor then began to write down our addresses (including our direct neighbor at 537 Second St) to stop the work that was taking place. The workers still continued to remove the sidewalk blocks. This sidewalk block only needed to be lifted and not removed; therefore we were charged for work that did not need to

be done. We were already in talks with neighbors to have the sidewalks lifted by a private company, and to take care of the situ ation on our own.

There were several witnesses present during this situation, all of whom agreed that the way the whole situation was handled was unprofessional and unfair to the residents of this block. We have personally lived in this house since 1982, and has been in our family for more than 50 years. There was a time when the city of Ann Arbor took care of the town, and as of late is has become the residents responsibility. Isn't this why we pay taxes?

Another example of the cities negligence that directly affects us is the removal of a large and dangerous tree stump on our property's extension. The stump itself is approximately 3.5' across and 2' tall. The stump remained there for 10 years. When the forestry department cut down the tree, a large piece fell and cracked the sidewalk. The forestry department was contacted and never responded to our concerns. This incident was again never acknowledged by the department or the city. 10 years after the tree was cut down there was a poor attempt to remove the stump, and in the process completely ruined the extension, requiring 40 lbs on dirt and grass seed to repair the damage. They returned a second time to remove the stump, and once again only ruined the extension. The extension had to be repaired again, we never asked for any type of reimbursement for this incident.

Recently, at one of the city council meetings, Barb Murphy (Second Street resident) presented our previous letter and bill as well as the neighbors documents, with no response. This is not an individual concern, it has directly affected the entire block of Second St. between Madison and Jefferson.

This is a really upsetting matter considering the fact that there are still many other sidewalks that have not been repaired. They are the ones that should be charged an administration fee, not us. Our sidewalk has been repaired. We truly hope that this letter is not ignored and that we will not have to contact our attorneys to further asses this issue.

Dear Mr. Mayor and City Council members:

When the City began charging for commercial trash pickup, the initial rate quoted was about \$80/month (for a 6 yd container). This was more than commercial haulers charged, so we had the containers we owned hauled away from our City of Ann Arbor locations, and we signed a contract with Waste Management for about \$60/month per location. Within months, the City (realizing its mistake? responding to complaints?) cut its rate about in half, leaving us in the situation of paying about 50% more than we would have had we kept our dumpsters and stayed with City service. At \$20/month more for four City locations, that has been costing us at least \$80/month ever since. (And I'll admit that I've been doing a slow burn as I've paid every one of those bills).

Now that our contracts with Waste Management have expired, we decided to bite the bullet and start switching back to City service. We saw this as a calculated risk because the cost of purchasing a 6 yard dumpster is about \$1200, which would mean a two year payback before realizing any savings (using the figures of \$40/month for City service and \$90/month for Waste Management). Still, last year we went ahead and purchased a dumpster for one of our locations and switched service back to the City.

Today I started to look into switching service at other locations and learned that the City will very likely give Waste Management a contract for its commercial trash hauling, and that WM will provide the dumpsters at no charge. Of course, this means that we just wasted hundreds of dollars purchasing a new dumpster, but if what Tom McMurtrie told me today is true, it is also true that the City's new charge for servicing a 6 yard dumpster will be HIGHER than what I am currently paying Waste Management. As the attached bills show, the proposed \$100/month charge would be more than 10% higher than what WM currently charges us, and a whopping 150% higher than the City's current charge.

I realize times are hard, the cost of managing waste continually increases, and the City needs to cut services to match the loss of revenue, but it seems to me that gaining a contract the size of the one WM would get from the City would mean that they could charge LESS than they currently charge their customers, not more. So, since it is looking like the City will be dropping this service to business taxpayers, I would like to request that the City Council at least negotiate a price with the new provider—whichever company that may be—which is not more than the market rate.
