Section 15(8) of the MCFA provides that a person who files a complaint with a false certification is responsible for a civil violation of the MCFA. The person may be required to pay a civil fine of up to \$1,000 and some, or all, of the expenses incurred by the Michigan Department of State and the alleged violator as a direct result of the filing of the complaint. MCL 169.215(16).

The financial disclosure acts prohibit a person from filing a complaint with a false certification. MCL 169.313(7); MCL 15.713(7).

SECTION 3 – ALLEGATIONS

Section(s) of the MCFA violated: MCL 169.244(2); MCL 169.271(2)

Explain how those section(s) were violated: Yousef Rabhi is running to be the next Mayor of Ann Arbor. On January 25, 2026, Mr. Rabhi formed a candidate committee to support his mayoral run—Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor.

On or about the week of July 6, 2026, Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor mailed literature to electors throughout the City of Ann Arbor. The mailers that landed in Wards 2, 3, 4, and 5 contained special messages—endorsements of candidates for City Council. For example, the mailer sent to electors in Ward 5 included the following language:

Yousef endorses Greg Monroe for City Council Ward 5

“It’s clear Greg cares deeply about our city and is striving for a future we can all share together. He’s committed to serving through real engagement and collaboration, pursuing growth that includes households of all incomes and protecting the trees and natural areas that make Ann Arbor a wonderful place to call home. That’s the type of leadership Ward 5 deserves, and I’m proud to support him.”

Exhibit 4. Each mailer included similar language for the Ward-specific candidate. See Exhibit 1 (endorsing Teesha Montague); Exhibit 2 (endorsing Ryan Bartholomew); Exhibit 3 (endorsing Dave Zeglen).

The Michigan Campaign Finance Act, 1976 PA 388, as amended, MCL 169.201 to 169.282 (the “MCFA”), does not consider an endorsement, in and of itself, to have value.¹ The means of disseminating the endorsement may, however, have value and be considered a contribution.² The MCFA defines a “contribution” as

a payment, gift, subscription, assessment, expenditure, contract, payment for services, dues, advance, forbearance, loan, or donation of money or anything of ascertainable monetary value, or a transfer of anything of ascertainable monetary value to a person, made for the purpose of influencing the nomination or election of a candidate, for the qualification, passage, or defeat of a ballot question, or for the qualification of a new political party.

MCL 169.204(1). Relatedly, an “in-kind contribution” is defined as “a contribution . . . other than money.” MCL 169.209(4).

The mailers at issue are a donation of something of ascertainable monetary value—the mailers were sent to electors throughout four wards in the City of Ann Arbor that advertised and promoted the endorsements.

These circumstances trigger a prohibition that is contained twice within the MCFA. First, Section 44(2) provides that “[a] candidate committee shall not make a contribution to or an independent expenditure on behalf of another candidate committee.” MCL 169.244(2). A single knowing violation of Section 44 results in a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment of up to 90 days, a fine of up to \$1,000.00, or both. MCL 169.244(5).

Second, Section 71(2) provides that “[a] candidate committee shall not make a contribution to another candidate committee.” MCL 169.271(2). A single knowing violation of Section 71 holds the same punishment as that of Section 44. See *id.*

In circulating each mailer to four of the five wards within the City of Ann Arbor, Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor violated the Michigan Election Law by contributing to each other candidate. Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor’s mailers constitute in-kind contributions to each of the four City Council candidate committees—they are contributions other than money with ascertainable monetary value, *i.e.*, the amount of money spent to design, print, and send each mailer.

Moreover, because Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor funded and circulated a citywide mailer that includes Mr. Rabhi’s endorsement of four candidates for City Council, the endorsements were advertised and promoted—they went well beyond mere endorsements, in and of themselves. Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor necessarily made contributions to the candidates for City Council that Mr. Rabhi endorsed.

In other words, Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor—a candidate committee—made contributions to the following candidate committees: (1) Montague for A2; (2) Committee to Elect Ryan Bartholomew; (3) Dave Zeglen for the People; and (4) Greg Monroe for City Council.

Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor’s contributions explicitly violate Sections 44(2) and 71(2) of the MCFA. A candidate committee may not make a contribution to another candidate committee. This is precisely what occurred here.

I respectfully ask that the Department of State find that there may be reason to believe that Yousef Rabhi for Ann Arbor violated Sections 44(2) and 71(2) of the MCFA on at least four occasions.

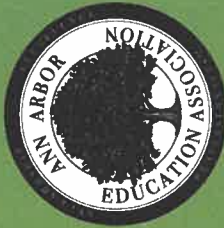

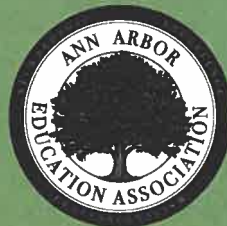

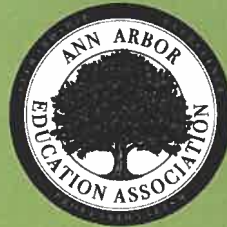
