Dear Mr. Hall:

I am responding to your request under the Michigan Freedom of Information Act, dated May 4, 2009 and received on May 5, 2009. Your request for "all records produced, prepared, or otherwise created by Ann Arbor City Council members during the City Council's March 2, 2009 and March 16, 2009 meetings" is granted in part and denied in part. The information has been denied to the extent that the following redactions have occurred:

1. Information of a personal nature if public disclosure of the information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of an individual's privacy. MCL 15.243(1)(a)
2. Documents and portions of documents that constitute communications from attorneys in the City Attorney's Office to City staff and/or Council members. These documents are subject to the attorney-client privilege and/or work product privilege. MCL 15.243(1)(g), (h)
3. Communications and notes between City staff that are of an advisory nature to the extent that they cover other than purely factual materials and are preliminary to a final agency determination of policy or action and for which the public interest in encouraging frank communication between officials and employees of public bodies outweighs the public interest in disclosure. MCL 15.243(1)(m)

The City does not warrant or guarantee the accuracy of the information provided. Rather, it provides the documents only to comply in good faith with the Michigan Freedom of Information Act, and not for any other purpose.

If you receive written notice that your request has been denied, in whole or in part, under Section 10 of the Act, you may, at your option either: (1) submit to the City Administrator a written appeal that specifically states the word "appeal" and identifies the reason(s) for reversal of the disclosure denial; or (2) file a lawsuit in the circuit court to compel the City's disclosure of the record. If after judicial review, the circuit court determines that the City has not complied with the Act, you may be awarded reasonable attorneys' fees and damages as specified under the Act.

The Michigan Freedom of Information Act specifically provides that a public body may charge a fee for searching for and copying a public record. The cost for copying the records is \$9.21 payable to the City of Ann Arbor.

Mr. Bartha:

The Great Lakes Environmental Law Center seeks all records produced, prepared, or otherwise created by Ann Arbor City Council members during the City Council's March 16, 2009 and March 2, 2009 meetings. We are submitting this request to obtain records that will allow the Great Lakes Environmental Law Center and members of the public to fully understand the City Council meeting and resulting decisions. The Great Lakes Environmental Law Center makes this request pursuant to the Michigan Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), Public Act 442 of 1976, MCL 15.231 et seq.

For purposes of this request, "records" includes information of any kind, including writings (handwritten, typed, electronic or otherwise produced, reproduced or stored), letters, memoranda, correspondence, notes, emails, instant messages, text messages, drawings, graphs, charts, photographs, and any other compilation of data from which information can be obtained. Without limitation, the records requested include records at any stage of development, whether proposed, draft, pending, interim, final or otherwise. All such records are included in this request if they are in the possession of or otherwise under the control of the City of Ann Arbor.

This request is not limited to records relating to any specific agenda items from the March 16, 2009 and March 2, 2009 City Council Meetings.

To minimize the city's costs in producing these records, please exclude the following records from this request:

1. Records generated during any closed session (as defined in the Michigan Open Meetings Act, MCL 15.262(c)) of the February 17, 2009 City Council Meeting.
2. The meeting minutes and other records already made available to the public pursuant to the Michigan Open Meetings Act, MCL 15.261 et seq. and/or city policy on the city's website (<http://a2gov.legistar.com>).

Exempt Records

Should you decide to invoke a FOIA exemption as the basis for withholding any record responsive to this request, please include in your full or partial denial letter sufficient information for the Great Lakes Environmental Law Center to appeal the denial pursuant to M.C.L. § 15.235(4)(a). To comply with legal requirements, the following information must be included:

1. Basic factual material about each withheld item, including the originator, date, length, general subject matter, and location of each item; and
2. Explanations and justifications for denial, including the identification of the category within the governing statutory provision under which the document (or portion thereof) was withheld and a full explanation of how each exemption fits the withheld material.

If you determine that portions of a record requested are exempt from disclosure, please redact the exempt portions and provide the remainder of the record to the Great Lakes Environmental Law Center.

Format of Records Requested

To reduce or avoid the costs and labor of printing and/or photocopying records, we request that records be provided in electronic format wherever possible, including but not limited to records that are stored or maintained in electronic format. We will provide a USB drive or other media storage device for the records at our expense.

Fee Waiver Request

The Great Lakes Environmental Law Center requests that you waive all fees in connection with this request as provided by MCL § 15.234(1) (waiver of fee is appropriate where search for and provision of copies of the public record can be considered as primarily benefiting the general public). The Great Lakes Environmental Law Center will use the information to contribute significantly to public understanding of City Council members' deliberations during a public open meeting. The Great Lakes Environmental Law Center will make all records received available to the public. The Great Lakes Environmental Law Center is a non-profit organization registered as a charitable organization in Michigan, with no commercial interest in obtaining the requested information.

Willingness to Pay Fees Under Protest

While a fee waiver should be granted for the reasons set forth above, the Great Lakes Environmental Law Center is seeking these records regardless of the City's ultimate decision on the fee waiver request. The Great Lakes Environmental Law Center thus is willing to pay fees in keeping with the applicable statutory and regulatory requirements, if necessary and under protest, to enable the timely delivery of the records. Fees must be limited to actual costs of labor and copying, and the means for copying must be the most economical available. M.C.L. § 15.234(1) and (3). Furthermore, fees may only be assessed based on procedures and guidelines published by the City. *Id.* at (3). We therefore request that City identify the procedures and guidelines under which it assesses fees, and provide an itemized list of fees charged and the justification for them in order to establish compliance with the statutory requirements. In addition, any payment of fees does not constitute waiver of the Great Lakes Environmental Law Center's right to seek administrative or judicial review of any denial of its fee waiver request. Please contact me before undertaking any action that would result in a fee charge in excess of one hundred dollars.

Record Delivery

Pursuant to M.C.L. § 15.235(2), we expect a response to this request within 5 business days. We request the City, in responding to this request, to comply with all relevant deadlines and other obligations set forth in the Michigan FOIA. To reduce or avoid the costs and labor of printing and/or photocopying records, we request that records be provided in electronic format wherever possible, including but not limited to records that are stored or maintained in electronic format. We will provide a USB drive or other media storage device for the records at our expense.

Please produce the requested records on a rolling basis; at no point should the search for – or deliberation concerning – certain records delay the production of others that the City has already retrieved and elected to produce.

Budget Committee: Here is a spreadsheet summarizing all General Fund and internal service fund budget proposals. We need to give direction to Roger ASAP. **YOUR ACTION IS REQUIRED.**
 Notes/directions:

1. There are multiple sub-tabs:
 - * One tab for each service area
 - * One for "Other" (HR, IT, etc.)
 - * One for "1-time items" (which are non-operational items that would be need to be funded from General Fund reserves)

* The final master spreadsheet

2. Start with the far left sub-tab (Community Services). On the far right side of each page, there's a column for each of us with our initials. If you support making the change, place a "1" in the column. (Some proposals are required, and those already have "1"s for each of us). In some cases, I support going part of the way, so I inserted a "0.5" instead of a "1".
3. After everyone makes their insertions, I'll insert the dollars for items on which there is majority agreement, and then the MASTER SHEET will calculate how close we are to our targets. If we come up short (which we will), then we'll have to pick some more items.

That would be "At Grade Crossing" intersections w/ S. State Street and the Rail Road. At grade intersections w/ railroads are not desirable, have a history of tragic accidents, are not the best option for the general public - cars or pedestrians, in particular in an "Urban" environment. In addition and in our case, at grade crossing intersections at the State St and the RR would add a large burden on the traffic operations on both Stadium Blvd and S. State Street, may require expensive, extensive sometimes "impractical" changes to our streets system such as street widening in a fully developed residential area.

Whenever possible and for many years communities have been separating their auto traffic from the rail traffic by installing new bridges. A recent example in our area is the new bridge over the railroad and Huron River, at Dixboro Rd - near E. Huron River Dr. Converting our bridges to at grade crossing would be a step backward.

Russ- Thanks for your e-mail. As always, it was thoughtful. Frankly, you raise an excellent point about the City not providing direct grants to arts organizations. As you may know, the City spends over \$1 million in General Funds every year to support local human service non-profits. We spend more per capita than any other local government in the State of Michigan. But, I do not believe any of those funds have ever been allocated for arts groups.

Despite not funding local arts groups directly, the City has a new public art program for which we have set aside close to \$1,000,000 to support public art in Ann Arbor. This program surpasses any similar program in Michigan. We made this commitment -- despite these tough economic times -- through a small set-aside in our capital

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infrastructure fund (e.g., roads, water pipes, etc.). The vast majority of these funds do not come from the General Fund, and they are set aside out of capital budgets at small increments. Fortunately, those small increments have added up to a significant amount of money.

Unfortunately, the City is in no position to allocate \$250,000 in new funding from our General Fund, in addition to the \$1 million that we have set aside for public art. We face a \$7,000,000 General Fund deficit over the next two years. We will likely be forced to lay off employees and reduce services. The taxable value of property in Ann Arbor is falling for the first time. It will be enough of a challenge to main the public art and human service programs, let alone create a new program with new spending.

In light of all this, I support the Mayor's resolution because the State has been funding arts programs for years, and I believe they can find cuts elsewhere (e.g., more cuts to corrections, re-organization of State government, consolidation of school districts, etc.). However, I would not ask the State to increase its funding in these tough economic times. Under the same logic, the City cannot create a new funding stream to support new grants to arts organizations. Despite this unfortunate reality, I believe our public art program demonstrates an amazing commitment to the arts.

I hope you're well despite these really crappy times in which we live.

Dear Mayor Hieftje and Council members Teall, Smith, Greden, Derezinski, Hohnke and Anglin,

I understand the Mayor will introduce a resolution at tonight's City Council meeting encouraging Governor Granholm to refrain from cutting significant amounts of funding from the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA). The Governor's proposed cuts will essentially eliminate all MCACA grant funding to Ann Arbor arts organizations. Although I certainly support the notion of sustaining the MCACA (the Michigan Theater currently receives about \$52,000 in annual funding from MCACA), I think it is a bit hollow for Ann Arbor City government to tell the State government how to manage their budget in terms of funding for the arts.

I say this because the City of Ann Arbor does not support local arts organizations in any significant way. Traditionally a small amount of money is provided for the Ann Arbor Summer Festival and other little bits of funding are provided from time-to-time for special programs. However, this very modest, occasional, and not very strategic allocation of funding is not generally supportive of the arts excellence in our city and does not reflect how our community values the arts.

Might I suggest that the Ann Arbor City Council scour their budget and come up with \$250,000 to provide grants that would replace approximately one-half of the funding currently provided to Ann Arbor arts organizations by MCACA. If the City of Ann Arbor took this kind of stand to support the arts in this difficult time, our local government would then have the moral authority to forward their thoughts to the Governor and our State legislature about funding for the arts.

Times are tough. They are tough for the State, for the City -- well, let's face it they are tough for nearly everyone, including local arts organizations. The Dance Gallery Foundation has ceased operations. Other local arts organizations are teetering on the brink. The Michigan Theater has eliminated three full-time positions, our senior staff has taken significant pay cuts, our union employees are contributing a part of their pay back to the organization and generally the Michigan Theater's budget has been cut significantly. The elimination of MCACA grant funding next fiscal year will mean more cuts and more Ann Arbor area arts organizations ceasing operation.

So, my City Council friends and representatives please do something and put \$250,000 of transitional arts grant funding in the City's budget next year. It would be so much more powerful that merely saying something to a State Government that is so much more beleaguered than our own.

Dear Chris-

Thanks for taking the time to talk to me the other day regarding my concern with the current city ordinance about snow clearing from the sidewalks. As I mentioned I am a native of Ann Arbor and have been in business here for over 24 years. My Company was started by my Father here in 1948. I own and rent out some houses on campus and have never had any problems or been ticketed for anything in the past. I have always prided myself on how I run my properties. I

have a house at 1012 S. Forest where I recently received a citation for having "slush" on the sidewalk. I have a very good maintenance person that I pay well to shovel the sidewalk and salt it for me. As you know the snow fall and temperatures this winter have been horrible. We do the absolute best we can and shoveled the snow at this address as soon as possible. The tenants at this house claim they got a warning notice that the sidewalk was not acceptable on Friday morning Jan. 30, 2009. I do not know when the notice was put up but that is when they first saw it and called me. I sent my person out that day and he shoveled some more and put more salt down. He went back on Saturday and put more salt down. I then received a ticket for \$130 because of too much Slush!

I think the city has an obligation to contact the Owner of the property if they are holding them responsible. The city housing dept. has my email, cell phone, work and home phone numbers. Putting a warning notice on the door of the house often will not get relayed from the tenants. I also believe the city ordinance is very unreasonable as currently written, you can not expect to have perfectly cleared sidewalks within 24 hours of a storm and sub-zero temperatures. We did everything we could do and still get a ticket. I really feel this is unfair. Know body should be expected to clear all the SLUSH from the sidewalk after they have been shoveled and salted. Perhaps the city could give a 48 hour notice and lower the standards or clearing. I also do not see how slush can even be monitored as it can not be removed short of vacuuming the sidewalk?

I can understand the situation the city is in trying to please people who expect to walk all around town shortly after a snow storm and have perfectly cleared sidewalks down to the concrete but they need to realize this is not reasonable. The current ordinance is wrong and needs to be addressed. I have never had this kind of harassment before and it appears to many of my fellow citizens as a revenue generator for the city.

I appreciate your time and looking into this matter. I plan to go to court Feb. 26th to fight this ticket.

Yes, I am saying that... You know by now that I'm not in principle against living wage, IF we were only made to pay it to people who are actually making a living. But as you know, we pay work study students as program assistants, they come in and help kids with their homework, serve them dinner etc. We employ a ton of them from about 3 - 7 pm, when we need them. It's not as if we're trying to not pay "a" living wage -- but paying students who work a few hours here and there for their spending money is something completely different. But because we pay them such high wages, we can't pay our community center directors the wages we feel we should be paying them. THEIR salaries are kept lower, because of what we have to pay part-timers. So the people who ARE actually earning a living, - their salaries could be larger if we didn't have to pay afterschool program assistants so much. Same story with our summer camp counselors... we have to pay them living wage too...

I don't know if exempting some non-profits is the answer, or if there is another way to deal with this issue. I think when you're dealing with children and youth programs you're going to run into this... I'd love for you to help figure this out...you probably know as much about this as anyone...

As a resident of Ward 3, specifically 1820 Crestland, I just wanted to express my extreme disappointment with this multi-year expensive, unfair and inconsistently executed program. Our neighborhood was targeted for repairs late last summer and most of our neighbors complied and paid the bill.

As my wife and I now increase our daily walks throughout the neighborhood we notice:

- Marked (silver circles) sidewalk squares that have not been repaired (Issue: Homeowner follow-up and monitoring)
- Many not marked, fully cracked squares, not repaired (these squares did not crack this winter!) (Issue: Competency of evaluators)
- Unmarked, now cracked squares, adjacent to newly repaired squares (Issue: Poor workmanship)

But the most surprising issue that still has not been addressed was one I raised last summer with the Ann Arbor city government and Ann Arbor public schools. The sidewalk squares along Ridge Road at the bus stop area for the school children of Pattengill were never repaired. One very large section, in particular, was and is crumbling rapidly. Hundreds of school kids walk on it each day. Ironically, all the sidewalks and the main entrance of the school were replaced and/or repaired fully on the parking lot side of the school last summer. I received email replies for raising my concern, but there is clearly no action plan and/or collaboration and cooperation between this 2 government groups. Safety, not neighborhood cosmetics must be a primary concern.

Lastly, given these difficult economic times and possibly the increased availability of highly qualified and skilled craftsmen who are unemployed, this expensive program (\$10Ks or \$100Ks or perhaps even \$1Ms)

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should be done completely with quality with the right people or IT SHOULD BE CANCELED and THE APPROPRIATE CITY EMPLOYEES NEED TO BE ACCOUNTABLE!
