Mike, I didn't get a chance to get these out to you before I left the office on Friday as I was in meetings the rest of the afternoon. Below is the scope of work in the contract for Project Grow. I'll forward the email I sent to Vivienne regarding funding request for fy10 and 11.

EXHIBIT A SCOPE OF SERVICES

General

Contractor agrees to provide general operation and managerial services related to community gardens throughout the City of Ann Arbor in accordance with this Agreement and as specified in this Exhibit.

In connection with the provision of Services under this Agreement, Contractor does not have any authority to execute any contract or agreement on behalf of the City, and is not granted any authority to assume or create any obligation or liability on the City's behalf, or to bind the City in any way.

Required Operation and Management Activities

- 1. Maintain at least five (5) community garden site areas throughout the City during the contract period. Sites located on City property currently are: Leslie Science Center (under pre-existing arrangement and subject to terms of the Partnership Agreement with LSNC), Buhr Park, Greenview Park (subject to lease arrangements with Ann Arbor Public Schools) and Ann Arbor City Airport. Sites located on non-City owned property currently are: Catholic Social Services, County Farm Park, Clague Middle School, Foodgatherers, Hillside Terrance, Lakewood Elementary School, Mitchell Elementary School and Matthaei Botanical Gardens.
- 2. Conduct at least one activity relative to gardening open to the general public during the contract period with a focus on reaching low-income City residents.
- 3. Conduct at least three (3) community education classes on composting and/or gardening at any of Project Grow's public garden sites during the contract period, with a focus on reaching low-income City residents.
- 4. Maintain the organic demonstration garden at the Leslie Science Center during the contract period.
- 5. Publish, at least once during the contract period, an informational newsletter circulated to Project Grow members and other interested individuals and organizations.

1. Provide Status Reports on required activities in Exhibit A to the Community Services Area Administrator in accordance with the following schedule:

- 2. Provide financial audit report within sixty (60) days of close of Contractors current fiscal year or March 1, 2009, whichever is earlier, to Community Services Area Administrator.
- 3. Develop and provide a Strategic Plan for Project Grow which details how the organization will achieve greater self-sufficiency over the next five (5) years to the Community Services Administrator no later than January 2, 2009.

Jayne,

Melissa Kesterson has asked me to assume the responsibility of putting together Project Grow's request to the City for a grant in the upcoming budget. As you have gathered, this organization's strengths lie in working with volunteers and gardeners and not in formal administrative process. I think their mission is important to the general welfare of Ann Arbor and I am simply volunteering to attempt to meet your requirements for this request.

I understand that sooner is better but December is the deadline. Is there any particular format that we should follow?

I was considering a one- to two-page statement with an overview of Project Grow's mission and its contribution with some specifics about the number of community garden plots. I am guessing that they are going to ask for the same amount (\$7000/a) as before. This request would be in the body of the statement.

Also, you indicated that you want a fiscal statement for the last two years. Do you mean 2007 and 2008 or were you thinking of a different pair of years? Of course we are not yet at the end of 2008, so we would be dealing with projected income and costs, not actuals.

They provided me with a two-year Excel spreadsheet that shows actuals (but not projected) for 2007 and projected amounts with some actuals for 2008. Is this adequate or was there other information or a different format that you would expect to receive? Their budget spreadsheet raises some questions because it is not very detailed or explicit. I think this can be attributed to the fact that they have a volunteer treasurer rather than a business manager or accountant. If there is additional information or explanation that you require, I would appreciate some hints and I can try to resolve them.

Thank you for any help you can give with this. I realize that you have a great many responsibilities and this is a very small piece of the picture, but it is important to one sector of our community.

Hi Jayne,

Thanks so much for your reply. I forwarded this to my current email account because the one you answered to will be expiring at the end of this month. Please change your address book for my address to

Melissa forwarded your earlier instructions to me and these that you have now provided are much more helpful.

With regard to audited statements, do you mean by an accounting firm, a CPA, or by some other professional? Yes

I think that they (Project Grow) use calendar year budgeting. When you ask for statements for 2006-2009, are you referring to those calendar years or to the city's budget years? I am looking for statements from Project Grow's budget years of 2006-2009. The City budget for FY09 does have \$7000 allocated for Project Grow. The contract with Project Grow has two disbursements of that \$7000, one in January 2009 and one in April 2009. When Project Grow shows that money depends on when the fiscal year of Project Grow is.

As I understand, the city has already placed an allocation to Project Grow for \$7000 into the 2009 budget (am I correct that FY 2009 began on July 1?). So the budget for 2009 should reflect the current allocation?

I think that Project Grow was accustomed in the past to invoicing the city at the end of the growing season. I assume that the current allocation of \$7000, in the FY 2009 budget, is the subject of the invoice/contract that Melissa has been working with your staff on. That should reflect the growing season for the 2008 calendar year, but the FY 2009 budget. So Project Grow should be submitting a request for both the 2010 and 2011 FY budgets, correct? FY 2010 would be payable in the fall of 2009 (calendar) and FY 2011 in the fall of 2010, if awarded.

Project Grow needs to decide what they want to request money for and for what FY's, FY10 or FY11 or both.

In my view, the service that Project Grow is performing is the provision of community gardening plots, so I assume that their proposal will be to offer this service. Is there any issue with the number of plots offered or is it adequate to state that they will offer plots consistent with prior practice, plus continuing to seek new locations for expanding the number of plots offered?

Again, this is up to Project Grow on what they want to request.

Thank you very much for your reply and for this clarification. I know that this is a very small issue in the greater view of city operations and I appreciate the time you are giving to it.



Dear Mark,

I am curious about the location of the mechanical platform. Did the HDC consider whether it could be on top of the building?

The location of this platform (I went to see it) causes exhaust to blow into the door & windows of the residential units across the 'alley'. Locating the mechanicals on the roof would reduce the noise and nuisance. Was this considered?

The platform itself also creates a nuisance by creating a dark area in an otherwise well-lighted public walkway that might become a potential problem. That side of the 'alley' has irregular building depths, and this platform creates a dark, sheltered space where previously there was an open space that precluded loitering. As this is directly opposite dwelling units, it's a potential public safety issue. Was this considered in the design phase?

I'm not requiring a change in the plans. I'm trying to understand how such plans come to be.

Blue Tractor was granted approval by the Historic District Commission (HDC) to construct a platform to place their mechanical equipment on. HDC approval was required because they are located in the Main Street Historic District. Their contractor subsequently commenced construction of a larger platform than what was approved and we are working with them through their Architects (Quinn Evans who applied for and received HDC approval) to address the matter by either reducing the size of the platform or go back to HDC for approval of the larger one. They have been very cooperative thus far and we hope to have this resolved soon. At this time we have placed a stop work order on the permit for the mechanical equipment installation. We only met with them yesterday and are hoping to hear back from them soon on how they intend to proceed. Will keep you advised.

Dear Friends,

I am concerned about the current difficulty in recycling fluorescent tubes and CFLs. I can't imagine that many Ann Arbor residents go to the trouble of driving out to the Drop-off Center and paying \$1.00 every time one of their fluorescents burns out. Despite the importance to our environment of removing the mercury content in these bulbs, I expect that almost all of the hundreds of thousands of such bulbs in use in Ann Arbor are just put in the trash and dumped in a landfill.

With all the constant environmental advice to reduce our carbon footprints by using CFLs instead of incandescents, it seems to me that we need a more user-friendly system for recycling fluorescents when they burn out.

Ideally this would be a no-cost pick-up at curbside similar to what is now provided for batteries. (By the way I greatly appreciate the battery pick-up. My daughter in Ithaca [NY] always gives me her used batteries because Ithaca does not provide this service.) Would it be feasible for Recycle Ann Arbor to provide this service??? I certainly hope so.

Hi Leigh. Your timing is impeccable--staff has been working on this issue for awhile now--including Systems Planning, Field Ops, Safety Office, Communications and recently, Washtenaw County staff. We are coming at the issue from a number of fronts including curbside and non-curbside (multi-family) residential, downtown (alley), and overall commercial sector. We have also been in contact with Rep. Warren's office concerning possible statewide legislation to require retailers to "take back" CFL's sold to the public.

Some national chains and local retailers are already providing this service to their customers. The DDA has made some grant \$\$ available to develop a pilot recycling program for used florescents in the downtown. Finally, we have started to engage local religious congregations as well, with the potential for informal drop-off locations to encourage CFL use and recycling.

I am concerned about the current difficulty in recycling fluorescent tubes and CFLs. I can't imagine that many Ann Arbor residents go to the trouble of driving out to the Drop-off Center and paying \$1.00 every time one of their fluorescents burns out. Despite the importance to our environment of removing the mercury content in these bulbs, I expect that almost all of the hundreds of thousands of such bulbs in use in Ann Arbor are just put in the trash and dumped in a landfill.

With all the constant environmental advice to reduce our carbon footprints by using CFLs instead of incandescents, it seems to me that we need a more user-friendly system for recycling fluorescents when they burn out.

Ideally this would be a no-cost pick-up at curbside similar to what is now provided for batteries. (By the way I greatly appreciate the battery pick-up. My daughter in Ithaca [NY] always gives me her used batteries because Ithaca does not provide this service.) Would it be feasible for Recycle Ann Arbor to provide this service??? I certainly hope so.

As it happens, City staff is currently exploring several pilot projects to expand recycling of CFLs and other similar items. Here is a summary from our Solid Waste Manager:

Staff has been working on this issue for awhile now--including Systems Planning, Field Ops, Safety Office, Communications and recently, Washtenaw County staff. We are coming at the issue from a number of fronts including curbside and non-curbside (multi-family) residential, downtown (alley), and overall commercial sector. We have also been in contact with Rep. Warren's office concerning possible statewide legislation to require retailers to "take back" CFL's sold to the public.

Some national chains and local retailers are already providing this service to their customers. The DDA has made some grant \$\$ available to develop a pilot recycling program for used florescents in the downtown. Finally, we have started to engage local religious congregations as well, with the potential for informal drop-off locations to encourage CFL use and recycling.

Once we have a more finalized set of recommendations, we will let you know.

Dear Friends,

I am concerned about the current difficulty in recycling fluorescent tubes and CFLs. I can't imagine that many Ann Arbor residents go to the trouble of driving out to the Drop-off Center and paying \$1.00 every time one of their fluorescents burns out. Despite the importance to our environment of removing the mercury content in these bulbs, I expect that almost all of the hundreds of thousands of such bulbs in use in Ann Arbor are just put in the trash and dumped in a landfill.

With all the constant environmental advice to reduce our carbon footprints by using CFLs instead of incandescents, it seems to me that we need a more user-friendly system for recycling fluorescents when they burn out.

Ideally this would be a no-cost pick-up at curbside similar to what is now provided for batteries. (By the way I greatly appreciate the battery pick-up. My daughter in Ithaca [NY] always gives me her used batteries because Ithaca does not provide this service.) Would it be feasible for Recycle Ann Arbor to provide this service??? I certainly hope so.

Dear Leigh,

Well, I cannot say I'm pleased with this offer.

Let's discuss this like gentlemen.

Audit is fine with me. The load is light, and I'm relatively good with nitpicking numbers. Tom Crawford seems to respect that.

Funders Forum is also fine. I really never wanted to be involved with human services. I do that for a living. I feel it's close to a conflict — and I worry about crossing a line. However, I intend to keep things separate, and it's important.

ZBA is good (offers should not be made to incoming members of Council, though, before current members of Council have chosen, or so I was told LAST YEAR). I should have an opportunity to work with the City and City issues. My focus has never been on the region, only.

Community Corrections: Before any of this discussion began, I had arranged to meet with Jean Carlberg to discuss my less-than-exciting time on this committee. I've also discussed it with the Chair, Barbara Bergman. I do think it presumptuous of you to imagine you know my background and interests without discussing them with me - ever! - but I told John last year that I was willing to do whatever I was assigned to, and I have stood by that for an entire year. I believe in serving the community. However, this area isn't my passion. No matter how important diverting people from jail may be, these meetings don't result in much action from me, and there doesn't seem to be much opportunity for me to have any takeaway to bring back to Council. I've talked about this with Jean, and she's offered some ideas. We'll meet. I'm not enthusiastic. There's been very little opportunity for me to use any of my skills -- I've been primarily a rubber stamp. Not my specialty.

Administration: If John wants to do this, I understand. However, I believe it would be valuable for you, Margie, Marcia, Stephen and me to learn to work with each other. There's been too much tension evidenced, and my overtures toward others on Council — however you may have felt them to be — have not been met with - well - welcome. I don't drink, and going to the bar makes me uncomfortable. We haven't been able to smooth over things socially, so I think we need to find a way to smooth things over politically. Learning to work together is a major part of that. If we NEVER have to cooperate or talk with each other, we aren't going to learn much about how to do that.

While the Audit committee does have other members of Council, the 2 or 3 meetings a year are just not opportunities to cooperate. I served on the sidewalk committee -- with Stephen, Steve Kunselman, Margie, and Mike -- but it was very

staff driven. I participated, didn't miss a meeting, and then went to every neighborhood meeting in the First Ward (including those that overlapped with the Second and the Fifth). It didn't result in a closer working relationship with Margie, although I hope it did with Stephen.

I've really tried to be very conscientious as a member of Council. I don't like being marginalized, and want to participate more fully. Administration is an excellent opportunity for us to learn to work together. We don't have to agree on everything in order to do that. As I tell anyone who asks, over 95% of all Council votes are unanimous for a reason -- they just make good sense. When members of Council differ on a vote, it's because they represent different views. Those different views are also represented in the community. It's OK that there are minority votes on Council. It encourages the public to see that their views are represented -- even if those are not the prevailing views.

Now, about **Planning**. Last year I — in my naiveté— asked for Planning. Planning is a really big job. John told me last year that, most of the time, members of Council who take on Planning do little else. The meetings can last as long as Council meetings, they occur the day following City Council meetings, and they require a lot of homework. I know; I've gone to quite a few in my year on Council. I went to quite a few before I joined Council, for that matter. As we all know—and as I learned — Joan did quite a bit more than 'little else' while serving on Planning.

I've been actively involved in neighborhood / planning issues for over 25 years. I have seen a lot of changes, and opposed a few of them. However, I have also demonstrated a clear interest in increasing the participation of citizens in the process <u>before</u> issues come to Council. I have shown an understanding of the the zoning & planning codes and the implications for surrounding neighborhoods. I don't look at development as a piecemeal thing, but as it impacts the city as a whole.

My voice at Planning Commission would provide assurance to neighborhoods that they are being heard. It would not necessarily change any vote, mind you. Hearing someone's issues is not the same as agreeing with them. Far too often, unfortunately, our citizens come to Planning and Council angry, and feel that no one is hearing their concerns. I care about the details. I don't get lost in them, but I study them. I do my homework. I report back — if anyone wants me to — dispassionately. I work hard, and I keep my commitments. I never shirk, and I never make excuses. I can be an advocate or — if needed — a more reserved participant in the process.

I don't take differences on issues personally. Each issue, once addressed, is over. Politics is about ever-changing alliances, not about friendships. Who I agree with today may not be who I agree with tomorrow. That's not because I'm inconsistent, but because I'm pragmatic and realistic. Once a battle over a political issue is over, there's always a new issue.

I'm aware that Planning is a Council appointment, and therefore a popularity contest. I also know that — with several of you — I'll never be popular. I'm not asking to be popular. I do think that I'd be an exemplary member of Planning. I believe you'd never hear a complaint from the staff or the public that I had failed to do the work, or that they felt they didn't get a fair hearing, or that I treated anyone with anything less than respect. I also believe you wouldn't hear that from the development community. I've met with many members of the development community, and the one common thing I've heard back is that they are truly surprised by my honesty and willingness to listen.

You imply that you are concerned about my time commitments. I appreciate your concern. As far as I can calculate those commitments that you are offering, they are as follows:

Audit: 2-3 hours any year.

Funders Forum: Perhaps as many as 6 hours a year. Of course, I'm guessing. We've met twice.

ZBA: 12 meetings (1 a month) of whatever duration. I know Ron found this onerous, but he never learned anything about zoning.

Community Corrections: perhaps 8 or 9 hours a year (September, October, November, January, February, March, April, May, June).

You consider my heavy workload to be about 40 hours spent in committee in a year???

I was very careful to seek committee assignments ONLY where members of the Council were leaving. Please consider greater options. I'd enjoy serving as Council liaison to the Huron River Watershed. I've volunteered there for over a decade. Then there's the Student Relations Committee — where you and I, Leigh, would have to work together. Most of the Campus is in the First Ward, after all.

I expected more from you all in this process. A phone call prior to committee assignments. An opportunity to talk. More of a sense of inclusion than exclusion.

- 1st reading of the proposed PUD re-zoning for City Place Apartments on Fifth Avenue, just south of the Library. 1st reading does not involve a public hearing. Agenda Item# DS-2 —Resolution to Petition the Washtenaw County Drain Commissioner to Design and Construct Stormwater Controls in the Allen Creek Drainage District of the Ann Arbor Farms Market

Question - In the information provided for the three Allen Creek drainage projects in the current packet, the anticipated reduction in phosphorous (lbs per year per upstream acre) is provided for two (Pioneer and Stadium Blvd), but not the third (Farmers Market). Can you please point me in the right direction for this figure for the market? (Hohnke)

Answer - The Farmers Market project will result in a phosphorous reduction of 0.34 lbs/acre/year. While the project does not have a significant impact on phosphorous reduction in the watershed, it does treat and detain the "first flush" volume for the site (1.13 acres). The first flush is defined as the first half inch of runoff from the drainage area during a rain event. It is important to capture this first flush volume, as it contains over 95% of the pollutants that run off of the surrounding lands.

The goal of the Allen Creek projects is to improve water quality, reduce flooding reduce flow variability, and increase public understanding. The Farmers Market project was selected for the educational opportunities that this highly visible and frequently visited location provides. The project includes visible features designed to raise awareness about stormwater: a green roof, educational signage and possibly a hands-on waterscape.

Stormwater and water quality education is not only required as part of the City's stormwater permit, but it is critical to water quality improvements in the watershed. As the public becomes aware of their impact on stormwater, behaviors change and then the volume of water in the stormwater system, as well as the amount of pollutants on our lawns, roadways and sidewalks will decrease.

Dear Leigh.

Well, I cannot say I'm pleased with this offer.

Let's discuss this like gentlemen.

Audit is fine with me. The load is light, and I'm relatively good with nitpicking numbers. Tom Crawford seems to respect that

Funders Forum is also fine. I really never wanted to be involved with human services. I do that for a living. I feel it's close to a conflict -- and I worry about crossing a line. However, I intend to keep things separate, and it's important. ZBA is good (offers should not be made to incoming members of Council, though, before current members of Council have chosen, or so I was told LAST YEAR). I should have an opportunity to work with the City and City issues. My focus has never been on the region, only.

Community Corrections: Before any of this discussion began, I had arranged to meet with Jean Cariberg to discuss my less-than-exciting time on this committee. I've also discussed it with the Chair, Barbara Bergman. I do think it presumptuous of you to imagine you know my background and interests without discussing them with me - ever! - but I

told John last year that I was willing to do whatever I was assigned to, and I have stood by that for an entire year. I believe in serving the community. However, this area isn't my passion. No matter how important diverting people from jail may be, these meetings don't result in much action from me, and there doesn't seem to be much opportunity for me to have any takeaway to bring back to Council. I've talked about this with Jean, and she's offered some ideas. We'll meet. I'm not enthusiastic. There's been very little opportunity for me to use any of my skills -- I've been primarily a rubber stamp. Not my specialty.

Administration: If John wants to do this, I understand. However, I believe it would be valuable for you, Margie, Marcia, Stephen and me to learn to work with each other. There's been too much tension evidenced, and my overtures toward others on Council — however you may have felt them to be — have not been met with - well - welcome. I don't drink, and going to the bar makes me uncomfortable. We haven't been able to smooth over things socially, so I think we need to find a way to smooth things over politically. Learning to work together is a major part of that. If we NEVER have to cooperate or talk with each other, we aren't going to learn much about how to do that.

While the Audit committee does have other members of Council, the 2 or 3 meetings a year are just not opportunities to cooperate. I served on the sidewalk committee -- with Stephen, Steve Kunselman, Margie, and Mike -- but it was very staff driven. I participated, didn't miss a meeting, and then went to every neighborhood meeting in the First Ward (including those that overlapped with the Second and the Fifth). It didn't result in a closer working relationship with Margie, although I hope it did with Stephen.

I've really tried to be very conscientious as a member of Council. I don't like being marginalized, and want to participate more fully. Administration is an excellent opportunity for us to learn to work together. We don't have to agree on everything in order to do that. As I tell anyone who asks, over 95% of all Council votes are unanimous for a reason -- they just make good sense. When members of Council differ on a vote, it's because they represent different views. Those different views are also represented in the community. It's OK that there are minority votes on Council. It encourages the public to see that their views are represented -- even if those are not the prevailing views.

Now, about **Planning**. Last year I -- in my naïveté-- asked for Planning. Planning is a really big job. John told me last year that, most of the time, members of Council who take on Planning do little else. The meetings can last as long as Council meetings, they occur the day following City Council meetings, and they require a lot of homework. I know; I've gone to quite a few in my year on Council. I went to quite a few before I joined Council, for that matter. As we all know -- and as I learned -- Joan did quite a bit more than 'little else' while serving on Planning.

I've been actively involved in neighborhood / planning issues for over 25 years. I have seen a lot of changes, and opposed a few of them. However, I have also demonstrated a clear interest in increasing the participation of citizens in the process <u>before</u> issues come to Council. I have shown an understanding of the the zoning & planning codes and the implications for surrounding neighborhoods. I don't look at development as a piecemeal thing, but as it impacts the city as a whole.

My voice at Planning Commission would provide assurance to neighborhoods that they are being heard. It would not necessarily change any vote, mind you. Hearing someone's issues is not the same as agreeing with them. Far too often, unfortunately, our citizens come to Planning and Council angry, and feel that no one is hearing their concerns. I care about the details. I don't get lost in them, but I study them. I do my homework. I report back — if anyone wants me to — dispassionately. I work hard, and I keep my commitments. I never shirk, and I never make excuses. I can be an advocate or — if needed — a more reserved participant in the process.

I don't take differences on issues personally. Each issue, once addressed, is over. Politics is about ever-changing alliances, not about friendships. Who I agree with today may not be who I agree with tomorrow. That's not because I'm inconsistent, but because I'm pragmatic and realistic. Once a battle over a political issue is over, there's always a new issue.

I'm aware that Planning is a Council appointment, and therefore a popularity contest. I also know that -- with several of you -- I'll never be popular. I'm not asking to be popular. I do think that I'd be an exemplary member of Planning. I believe you'd never hear a complaint from the staff or the public that I had failed to do the work, or that they felt they didn't get a fair hearing, or that I treated anyone with anything less than respect. I also believe you wouldn't hear that from the development community. I've met with many members of the development community, and the one common thing I've heard back is that they are truly surprised by my honesty and willingness to listen.

You imply that you are concerned about my time commitments. I appreciate your concern. As far as I can calculate those committee commitments that you are offering, they are as follows:

Audit: 2-3 hours any year.

Funders Forum: Perhaps as many as 6 hours a year. Of course, I'm guessing. We've met twice,

ZBA: 12 meetings (1 a month) of whatever duration. I know Ron found this onerous, but he never learned anything about zoning.

Community Corrections: perhaps 8 or 9 hours a year (September, October, November, January, February, March, April, May, June).

You consider my heavy workload to be about 40 hours spent in committee in a year???

I was very careful to seek committee assignments ONLY where members of the Council were leaving. Please consider greater options. I'd enjoy serving as Council liaison to the Huron River Watershed. I've volunteered there for over a

decade. Then there's the Student Relations Committee -- where you and I, Leigh, would have to work together. Most of the Campus is in the First Ward, after all.

I expected more from you all in this process. A phone call prior to committee assignments. An opportunity to talk. More of a sense of inclusion than exclusion.

Funders Forum: I believe you would like to continue serving on the Funders Forum. The Committee will recommend that you continue serving on this committee.

According to the information available on the Drain Commissioner's web site, the estimated cost for storm water retention construction at the Farmer's Market was anticipated to be between \$50,000 and \$70,000. The cost per cubic foot of storage, therefore, was between \$26 and \$37, and the cost per pound of phosphorus removal was \$5,900 and \$8,200.

This project is now estimated to cost \$599,600. Unfortunately — for me, at least — I cannot find anything in the packet, the background documents that accompany the packet, or the drain commissioner's website to explain why this specific part of the project has increased so in cost.

Dear Leigh,

Well, I cannot say I'm pleased with this offer. Let's discuss this like gentlemen. Audit is fine with me. The load is light, and I'm relatively good with nitpicking numbers. Tom Crawford seems to respect that.

Funders Forum is also fine. I really never wanted to be involved with human services. I do that for a living. I feel it's close to a conflict — and I worry about crossing a line. However, I intend to keep things separate, and it's important. ZBA is good (offers should not be made to incoming members of Council, though, before current members of Council have chosen, or so I was told LAST YEAR). I should have an opportunity to work with the City and City issues. My focus has never been on the region, only.

Community Corrections: Before any of this discussion began, I had arranged to meet with Jean Carlberg to discuss my less-than-exciting time on this committee. I've also discussed it with the Chair, Barbara Bergman. I do think it presumptuous of you to imagine you know my background and interests without discussing them with me - ever! - but I told John last year that I was willing to do whatever I was assigned to, and I have stood by that for an entire year. I believe in serving the community. However, this area isn't my passion. No matter how important diverting people from jail may be, these meetings don't result in much action from me, and there doesn't seem to be much opportunity for me to have any takeaway to bring back to Council. I've talked about this with Jean, and she's offered some ideas. We'll meet. I'm not enthusiastic. There's been very little opportunity for me to use any of my skills -- I've been primarily a rubber stamp. Not my specialty.

Administration: If John wants to do this, I understand. However, I believe it would be valuable for you, Margie, Marcia, Stephen and me to learn to work with each other. There's been too much tension evidenced, and my overtures toward others on Council -- however you may have felt them to be -- have not been met with - well - welcome. I don't drink, and going to the bar makes me uncomfortable. We haven't been able to smooth over things socially, so I think we need to find a way to smooth things over politically. Learning to work together is a major part of that. If we NEVER have to cooperate or talk with each other, we aren't going to learn much about how to do that.

While the Audit committee does have other members of Council, the 2 or 3 meetings a year are just not opportunities to cooperate. I served on the sidewalk committee — with Stephen, Steve Kunselman, Margie, and Mike — but it was very staff driven. I participated, didn't miss a meeting, and then went to every neighborhood meeting in the First Ward (including those that overlapped with the Second and the Fifth). It didn't result in a closer working relationship with Margie, although I hope it did with Stephen.

I've really tried to be very conscientious as a member of Council. I don't like being marginalized, and want to participate more fully. Administration is an excellent opportunity for us to learn to work together. We don't have to agree on everything in order to do that. As I tell anyone who asks, over 95% of all Council votes are unanimous for a reason -- they just make good sense. When members of Council differ on a vote, it's because they represent different views. Those different views are also represented in the community. It's OK that there are minority votes on Council. It encourages the public to see that their views are represented -- even if those are not the prevailing views.

Now, about **Planning**. Last year I -- in my naïveté-- asked for Planning. Planning is a really big job. John told me last year that, most of the time, members of Council who take on Planning do little else. The meetings can last as long as Council meetings, they occur the day following City Council meetings, and they require a lot of homework. I know; I've gone to quite a few in my year on Council. I went to quite a few before I joined Council, for that matter. As we all know -- and as I learned -- Joan did quite a bit more than 'little else' while serving on Planning.

I've been actively involved in neighborhood / planning issues for over 25 years. I have seen a lot of changes, and opposed a few of them. However, I have also demonstrated a clear interest in increasing the participation of citizens in the process <u>before</u> issues come to Council. I have shown an understanding of the the zoning & planning codes and the implications for surrounding neighborhoods. I don't look at development as a piecemeal thing, but as it impacts the city as a whole.

My voice at Planning Commission would provide assurance to neighborhoods that they are being heard. It would not necessarily change any vote, mind you. Hearing someone's issues is not the same as agreeing with them. Far too often, unfortunately, our citizens come to Planning and Council angry, and feel that no one is hearing their concerns. I care about the details. I don't get lost in them, but I study them. I do my homework. I report back — if anyone wants me to — dispassionately. I work hard, and I keep my commitments. I never shirk, and I never make excuses. I can be an advocate or — if needed — a more reserved participant in the process.

I don't take differences on issues personally. Each issue, once addressed, is over. Politics is about ever-changing alliances, not about friendships. Who I agree with today may not be who I agree with tomorrow. That's not because I'm inconsistent, but because I'm pragmatic and realistic. Once a battle over a political issue is over, there's always a new issue.

I'm aware that Planning is a Council appointment, and therefore a popularity contest. I also know that -- with several of you -- I'll never be popular. I'm not asking to be popular. I do think that I'd be an exemplary member of Planning. I believe you'd never hear a complaint from the staff or the public that I had failed to do the work, or that they felt they didn't get a fair hearing, or that I treated anyone with anything less than respect. I also believe you wouldn't hear that from the development community. I've met with many members of the development community, and the one common thing I've heard back is that they are truly surprised by my honesty and willingness to listen.

You imply that you are concerned about my time commitments. I appreciate your concern. As far as I can calculate those commitments that you are offering, they are as follows:

Audit: 2-3 hours any year.

Funders Forum: Perhaps as many as 6 hours a year. Of course, I'm guessing. We've met twice.

ZBA: 12 meetings (1 a month) of whatever duration. I know Ron found this onerous, but he never learned anything about

Community Corrections: perhaps 8 or 9 hours a year (September, October, November, January, February, March, April, May, June).

You consider my heavy workload to be about 40 hours spent in committee in a year???

I was very careful to seek committee assignments ONLY where members of the Council were leaving. Please consider greater options. I'd enjoy serving as Council liaison to the Huron River Watershed. I've volunteered there for over a decade. Then there's the Student Relations Committee — where you and I, Leigh, would have to work together. Most of the Campus is in the First Ward, after all.

I expected more from you all in this process. A phone call prior to committee assignments. An opportunity to talk. More of a sense of inclusion than exclusion.

I've been actively involved in neighborhood / planning issues for over 25 years. I have seen a lot of changes, and opposed a few of them. However, I have also demonstrated a clear interest in increasing the participation of citizens in the process <u>before</u> issues come to Council. I have shown an understanding of the the zoning & planning codes and the implications for surrounding neighborhoods. I don't look at development as a piecemeal thing, but as it impacts the city as a whole.

My voice at Planning Commission would provide assurance to neighborhoods that they are being heard. It would not necessarily change any vote, mind you. Hearing someone's issues is not the same as agreeing with them. Far too often, unfortunately, our citizens come to Planning and Council angry, and feel that no one is hearing their concerns. I care about the details. I don't get lost in them, but I study them. I do my homework. I report back — if anyone wants me to — dispassionately. I work hard, and I keep my commitments. I never shirk, and I never make excuses. I can be an advocate or — if needed — a more reserved participant in the process.

I don't take differences on issues personally. Each issue, once addressed, is over. Politics is about ever-changing alliances, not about friendships. Who I agree with today may not be who I agree with tomorrow. That's not because I'm

inconsistent, but because I'm pragmatic and realistic. Once a battle over a political issue is over, there's always a new issue.

I'm aware that Planning is a Council appointment, and therefore a popularity contest. I also know that — with several of you — I'll never be popular. I'm not asking to be popular. I do think that I'd be an exemplary member of Planning. I believe you'd never hear a complaint from the staff or the public that I had failed to do the work, or that they felt they didn't get a fair hearing, or that I treated anyone with anything less than respect. I also believe you wouldn't hear that from the development community. I've met with many members of the development community, and the one common thing I've heard back is that they are truly surprised by my honesty and willingness to listen.

You imply that you are concerned about my time commitments. I appreciate your concern. As far as I can calculate those committee commitments that you are offering, they are as follows:

Audit: 2-3 hours any year.

Funders Forum: Perhaps as many as 6 hours a year. Of course, I'm guessing. We've met twice.

ZBA: 12 meetings (1 a month) of whatever duration. I know Ron found this onerous, but he never learned anything about zoning.

Community Corrections: perhaps 8 or 9 hours a year (September, October, November, January, February, March, April, May, June).

You consider my heavy workload to be about 40 hours spent in committee in a year???

I was very careful to seek committee assignments ONLY where members of the Council were leaving. Please consider greater options. I'd enjoy serving as Council liaison to the Huron River Watershed. I've volunteered there for over a decade. Then there's the Student Relations Committee — where you and I, Leigh, would have to work together. Most of the Campus is in the First Ward, after all.

I expected more from you all in this process. A phone call prior to committee assignments. An opportunity to talk. More of a sense of inclusion than exclusion.

Clearly I have questions and concerns. You are free to contact me. My contact information is below.

It's a time-consuming process because we try to balance a variety of criteria -- none of which are dispositive on their own. These criteria include a Member's interests and requests, a Member's background and experience, seniority, and attendance/participation. It's impossible to give every Member 100% of what they want; even the most senior Members of Council (myself included) have assignments they might not prefer.

Below is a summary of your requests and the Committee's recommendations: **Audit Committee:** You asked to continue serving on the Audit Committee. The Committee will recommend that you continue serving on this committee.

Funders Forum: I believe you would like to continue serving on the Funders Forum. The Committee will recommend that you continue serving on this committee.

Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA): You asked to serve on the ZBA. The Committee was prepared to recommend that Christopher Taylor serve on ZBA, but after I received your e-mail, I discussed it with

him. Councilman Taylor deferred to you, and thus the Committee will recommend that you serve on ZBA.

Planning Commission: Two Councilmembers -- you and Councilmember Derezinski -- have expressed interest in serving on CPC. This is a Council appointment. Several members of Council have said they support appointing Councilmember Derezinski because of his significant planning experience.

Administration Committee: You asked to serve on the Council Administration Committee. The Committee will recommend that Mayor Hieftje fill the vacancy on the Administration Committee.

Community Corrections: The Committee will recommend that you continue to serve on this important committee considering your other committee assignments (i.e., workload). We'd be happy to discuss this in more detail, but we believe that this important committee fits well with your background. Councilmember Jean Carlberg served several years on this Committee and found it rewarding.

Well, I cannot say I'm pleased with this offer.

Let's discuss this like gentlemen.

Audit is fine with me. The load is light, and I'm relatively good with nitpicking numbers. Tom Crawford seems to respect that.

Funders Forum is also fine. I really never wanted to be involved with human services. I do that for a living. I feel it's close to a conflict -- and I worry about crossing a line. However, I intend to keep things separate, and it's important.

ZBA is good (offers should not be made to incoming members of Council, though, before current members of Council have chosen, or so I was told LAST YEAR). I should have an opportunity to work with the City and City issues. My focus has never been on the region, only.

Community Corrections: Before any of this discussion began, I had arranged to meet with Jean Carlberg to discuss my less-than-exciting time on this committee. I've also discussed it with the Chair, Barbara Bergman. I do think it presumptuous of you to imagine you know my background and interests without discussing them with me - ever! - but I told John last year that I was willing to do whatever I was assigned to, and I have stood by that for an entire year. I believe in serving the community. However, this area isn't my passion. No matter how important diverting people from jail may be, these meetings don't result in much action from me, and there doesn't seem to be much opportunity for me to have any takeaway to bring back to Council. I've talked about this with Jean, and she's offered some ideas. We'll meet. I'm not enthusiastic. There's been very little opportunity for me to use any of my skills -- I've been primarily a rubber stamp. Not my specialty.

Administration: If John wants to do this, I understand. However, I believe it would be valuable for you, Margie, Marcia, Stephen and me to learn to work with each other. There's been too much tension evidenced, and my overtures toward others on Council -- however you may have felt them to be -- have not been met with - well - welcome. I don't drink, and going to the bar makes me uncomfortable. We haven't been able to smooth over things socially, so I think we need to find a way to smooth things over politically. Learning to work together is a major part of that. If we NEVER have to cooperate or talk with each other, we aren't going to learn much about how to do that.

While the Audit committee does have other members of Council, the 2 or 3 meetings a year are just not opportunities to cooperate. I served on the sidewalk committee — with Stephen, Steve Kunselman, Margie, and Mike — but it was very staff driven. I participated, didn't miss a meeting, and then went to every neighborhood meeting in the First Ward (including those that overlapped with the Second and the Fifth). It didn't result in a closer working relationship with Margie, although I hope it did with Stephen.

I've really tried to be very conscientious as a member of Council. I don't like being marginalized, and want to participate more fully. Administration is an excellent opportunity for us to learn to work together. We don't have to agree on everything in order to do that. As I tell anyone who asks, over 95% of all Council votes are unanimous for a reason — they just make good sense. When members of Council differ on a vote, it's because they represent different views. Those different views are also represented in the community. It's OK that there are minority votes on Council. It encourages the public to see that their views are represented — even if those are not the prevailing views.

Now, about **Planning**. Last year I -- in my naïveté-- asked for Planning. Planning is a really big job. John told me last year that, most of the time, members of Council who take on Planning do little else. The meetings can last as long as Council meetings, they occur the day following City Council meetings, and they require a lot of homework. I know; I've gone to quite a few in my year on Council. I went to quite a few before I joined Council, for that matter. As we all know -- and as I learned -- Joan did quite a bit more than 'little else' while serving on Planning.

I've been actively involved in neighborhood / planning issues for over 25 years. I have seen a lot of changes, and opposed a few of them. However, I have also demonstrated a clear interest in increasing the participation of citizens in the process <u>before</u> issues come to Council. I have shown an understanding of the the zoning & planning codes and the implications for surrounding neighborhoods. I don't look at development as a piecemeal thing, but as it impacts the city as a whole.

My voice at Planning Commission would provide assurance to neighborhoods that they are being heard. It would not necessarily change any vote, mind you. Hearing someone's issues is not the same as agreeing with them. Far too often, unfortunately, our citizens come to Planning and Council angry, and feel that no one is hearing their concerns.

I care about the details. I don't get lost in them, but I study them. I do my homework. I report back — if anyone wants me to — dispassionately. I work hard, and I keep my commitments. I never shirk, and I never make excuses. I can be an advocate or — if needed — a more reserved participant in the process.

I don't take differences on issues personally. Each issue, once addressed, is over. Politics is about ever-changing alliances, not about friendships. Who I agree with today may not be who I agree with tomorrow. That's not because I'm inconsistent, but because I'm pragmatic and realistic. Once a battle over a political issue is over, there's always a new issue.

I'm aware that Planning is a Council appointment, and therefore a popularity contest. I also know that — with several of you — I'll never be popular. I'm not asking to be popular. I do think that I'd be an exemplary member of Planning. I believe you'd never hear a complaint from the staff or the public that I had failed to do the work, or that they felt they didn't get a fair hearing, or that I treated anyone with anything less than respect. I also believe you wouldn't hear that from the development community. I've met with many members of the development community, and the one common thing I've heard back is that they are truly surprised by my honesty and willingness to listen.

You imply that you are concerned about my time commitments. I appreciate your concern. As far as I can calculate those committee commitments that you are offering, they are as follows:

Audit: 2-3 hours any year.

Funders Forum: Perhaps as many as 6 hours a year. Of course, I'm guessing. We've met twice.

ZBA: 12 meetings (1 a month) of whatever duration. I know Ron found this onerous, but he never learned anything about zoning.

Community Corrections: perhaps 8 or 9 hours a year (September, October, November, January, February, March, April, May, June).

You consider my heavy workload to be about 40 hours spent in committee in a year???

I was very careful to seek committee assignments ONLY where members of the Council were leaving. Please consider greater options. I'd enjoy serving as Council liaison to the Huron River Watershed. I've volunteered there for over a decade. Then there's the Student Relations Committee — where you and I, Leigh, would have to work together. Most of the Campus is in the First Ward, after all.

I expected more from you all in this process. A phone call prior to committee assignments. An opportunity to talk. More of a sense of inclusion than exclusion.

Clearly I have questions and concerns. You are free to contact me. My contact information is below.

Funders Forum: I believe you would like to continue serving on the Funders Forum. The Committee will recommend that you continue serving on this committee.

Dear Tom and Stephen,

I am writing about what the City does (or should do) to enforce Section 14.3(e) of the City Charter, which states: "No contract shall be made with any person who is in default to the City."

I can think of at least three 'normal' situations in which a person might be "in default to the City." First, the person has not paid his/her property taxes. Second, the person has not paid fines owed to the City imposed by the courts --including traffic ticket fines. Third, the person is a current vendor with the City and fails to perform an existing contract.

My primary concern is that a developer might want to enter into a development agreement with the City even though the developer has not paid its taxes. There is a real chance of this happening in the present business climate. I find the idea that the developer can be in default to the City, but the default disappears when the County picks up the tax bill, truly amazing. Can it be that the developer would be able to sign an agreement the City while still in default because the County holds the City harmless? Wouldn't the developer still be in default — even if not to the City directly? And if not, why should the developer benefit from a relationship between governments?

I can conceive of a 'nightmare scenario' which goes like this: A developer signs a development agreement -- but is actually in tax default. The developer, plainly already in financial trouble, starts work, but is unable to perform its obligations to the City under the agreement. Then the developer's clever lawyer stumbles across Section 14.3(e) and concludes that there never was a legal agreement between the developer and the City because the City should not have made a contract with someone who is in default! Therefore, the developer would be able to back out of the agreement because it never existed legally.

I am sure there are other circumstances in which a person may want to make a contract with the City even though a default exists. My focus is on development, but I can certainly come up with other concepts involving vendors and private citizens.

I think we should guard against this possibility. The City's (and the taxpayers') interests should be protected. Is there a system now in place to make sure that anyone wanting a contract of any kind with the City is not in default in any way? If so, could you explain how it works?

If not, how can we create such a system? If action by Council is necessary, I would be happy to advocate for whatever might be needed.

Agenda Item Number: DS-2 Resolution to Petition the Washtenaw County Drain Commissioner to Design and Construct Stormwater Controls in the Allen Creek Drainage District at the Ann Arbor Farmers Market to Reduce Downstream Flooding and Improve Water Quality and to Appropriate Funds for these Stormwater Management Improvements (\$599,600.00 Project Amount; \$572,018.00 City Share)

Question Asked: In the information provided for the three Allen Creek drainage projects in the current packet, the anticipated reduction in phosphorous (lbs per year per upstream acre) is provided for two (Pioneer and Stadium Blvd), but not the third (Farmers Market). Can you please point me in the right direction for this figure for the market? (Hohnke)

Answer: The Farmers Market project will result in a phosphorous reduction of 0.34 lbs/year. While the project does not have a significant impact on phosphorous reduction in the watershed, it does treat and detain the "first flush" volume for the site (1.13 acres). The first flush is defined as the first half inch of runoff from the drainage area during a rain event. It is important to capture this first flush volume, as it contains over 95% of the pollutants that run off of the surrounding lands.

The goal of the Allen Creek projects is to improve water quality, reduce flooding reduce flow variability, and increase public understanding. The Farmers Market project was selected for the educational opportunities that this highly visible and frequently visited location provides. The project includes visible features designed to raise awareness about stormwater: a green roof, educational signage and possibly a hands-on waterscape.

Stormwater and water quality education is not only required as part of the City's stormwater permit, but it is critical to water quality improvements in the watershed. As the public becomes aware of their impact on stormwater, behaviors change and then the volume of water in the stormwater system, as well as the amount of pollutants on our lawns, roadways and sidewalks will decrease.

Question Asked: According to the information available on the Drain Commissioner's web site, the estimated cost for storm water retention construction at the Farmer's Market was anticipated to be between \$50,000 and \$70,000. The cost per cubic foot of storage, therefore, was between \$26 and \$37, and the cost per pound of phosphorus removal was \$5,900 and \$8,200.

This project is now estimated to cost \$599,600. Unfortunately -- for me, at least -- I cannot find anything in the packet, the background documents that accompany the packet, or the drain commissioner's website to explain why this specific part of the project has increased so in cost.

Can you please provide insight into the increased cost? (Briere)

Answer: The presentation on the Drain Commissioner's website was from a public meeting on February 29, 2008. Unfortunately, the table on slide 28 is not correct. The anticipated project cost should have been listed between \$500,000 and \$700,000. This would then change the cost per cubic foot of storage to \$316. The correct numbers were presented in a subsequent meeting in June, 2008. Unfortunately, a copy of that meeting has not yet been added to the Drain Commissioner's website.

As mentioned in the first caucus question on this agenda item, the goal of the Farmers Market project is not phosphorous removal, but to increase public awareness about stormwater and water quality through interpretive signage and visible water features. Public education is a required component of the City's stormwater permit, and the Farmers Market was viewed as an excellent site to provide this education. Effective education will lead to behavior change, and in turn, improved water quality in the Huron River.

Over the past 6 or 8 months I have been working with staff to bring a change to the city's graffiti ordinance, (see attachment) which would require property owners to clean graffiti off of buildings in a timely manner. The initiative for this change came from property owners and merchants who have noticed a severe uptick in graffiti just over the past year, and who recognize it's negative effect on the perception of our city. This ordinance is similar to our current clean communities program, in that it recognizes the importance of timely clean up as a way to deter the proliferation of such vandalism. We have worked out a lot of the details of enforcement and recognition, but we also know that this will be reviewed and re-tooled if necessary some time after implementation. We hope to bring this to Council for first reading at the first meeting in December, and we are looking to begin enforcement perhaps 90 days after publication, to give time for education efforts and to wait until the weather is better for cleaning off buildings. (I believe the length of time is left blank in this draft.)

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 9:6 OF CHAPTER 106 OF TITLE IX OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ANN ARBOR.

The City of Ann Arbor Ordains:

<u>Section 1</u>. That Section 9:6 of Chapter 106 of the Code of the City of Ann Arbor be amended to read as follows:

9:6. Graffiti.

- (1) "Graffiti" constitutes a public nuisance and means any mark or marks on any surface or structure made without the prior permission of the property owner and made in any manner, including but not limited to, writing, inscribing, drawing, tagging, sketching, spray-painting, painting, etching, scratching, carving, engraving, scraping, or attaching. Chalk marks on sidewalks is not "graffiti." Graffiti does not include any attaching which is posting of posters as permitted under Chapter 82, Section 7:102(3).
 - (2) No person shall apply graffiti to any surface or structure.

A violation of this subsection shall be a misdemeanor punishable by one or more of the following:

- (a) Community service that is as relevant and appropriate to the violation as possible;
- (b) Restitution;
- (c) A fine of not more than \$500.00 plus costs.
- (3) No person who owns or otherwise controls or manages any property shallpermit or allow any graffiti to be or remain on any surface or structure on the
 property beyond the time indicated in a notice [The term "notice" is not defined.
 What constitutes effective notice? Who is authorized to deliver "notices"? I think
 a clear definition would be useful.], which shall be no less than two (2) days
 after the notice is posted on the property or delivered to the property owner
 [What about adding as an option to notify the person who "otherwise controls or
 manages" the property? That would seem to be a party from whom we might
 get swifter action.] and no less than four (4) days if the notice is mailed. If
 removal of the graffiti by the date set in the notice is not possible due to
 weather or other reasonable cause, then on or before the date set in the notice
 the person to whom the notice is issued or his or her agent shall contact the
 City as indicated in the notice to request an extension.

A violation of this subsection shall be a civil infraction punishable by a fine of not

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more than \$500.00 plus costs, and/or equitable relief, and/or any other penalty available under the law, including but not limited to a court order requiring the defendant IWhy mix terms by referring to "the defendant"? The ordinance relates to owners/controllers/managers: I'd prefer consistency throughout the text to avoid confusion and lawyerly mischief, even though I recognize that in this context, they are too defendants.] to remove the graffiti. Each day upon which graffiti is present upon a property [I'd add "in violation of this 9:6(3)" because the graffiti is actually on the property before this subsection is violated and I don't think that we are trying to punish property owners for pre-notice graffiti.] constitutes a separate violation of this section. For a first offense, the fine shall be \$100.00, plus costs and all other remedies available by statute. For each additional or subsequent offense within a 2-year time period the fine shall be not less than \$250.00 and up to \$500.00, plus costs and all other remedies available by statute. (If every day is a separate offense, then the 2nd day in violation of (3), even in connection with the first incident, is a \$250-\$500 bump, yes? Perhaps add a non-contiguous offense concept? Also, who decides as to the size of the second fine?1

- (4) Notice by the City to remove graffiti [Isn't the "notice" a notice "of the presence of graffiti" rather than an "[order] to remove"? Semantic point maybe.] from a property may be made by mailing it to the property owner, as shown on assessment records, delivering it to the owner or posting it at a conspicuous place on the property. [Wouldn't it be more effective to include management company here too, if known?] [Can we authorize too whomever is authorized to deliver notices to do so in "or in such reasonable manner as _____ may from time to time select" or something like that? And another thing, why not email?]
- (5) In addition to or in lieu of charging a violation of this section, if any graffiti remains on the property in violation of this section [Do we mean in violation of (3) or the whole Section 9:6? If the whole section, then the City could go in, without notice and clean and charge. Maybe that's the intention, but it doesn't seem so.], then the City may remove the graffiti or have it removed in any reasonable manner that would be used by a responsible property owner. The actual cost to the City for the removal shall be charged to the owner and, if not paid, assessed against the property in accordance with section 1:292 of Chapter 13 of this Code. [Can we add allocable staff time too?]
 - (6) The provisions of this section [Again, is this provision directed at a violation of (3) or the whole 9:6?] do not require an election of remedies. The City may proceed under any one, some, or all of the provisions of this section and may bring any other legal action available, civil or criminal, to enforce the provisions of this section.
- (37) The victim may proceed with any private right of action provided under law against a person who has applied graffiti or the parent or guardian of a minor.

> RE: Proposed Procedures for the Transfer of Liquor License from Papa Chulos, Inc., to <u>V.R. Entertainment Network, Inc.</u>

We have identified the concerns of the Liquor Commission, and have provided a succinct statement for proposed action. The issues are as follows:

Police complaints of various natures:

It is our intention to address any and all complaints by the Ann Arbor police as quickly as possible and to rectify the situation so that it does not occur again.

However, it is important to note that we will curtail any behavior which is in our power to control and that we take all complaints very seriously.

Our staffing will be formed and trained with previous complaints in mind in order to assure that full compliance with the Ann Arbor Police is in place.

Police complaints will be further deterred by implementing the following:

- a. aggressive checking of identification at the door, and attempting to weed out any false ID's.
- b. strict usage of wristbands for patrons aged 21 and over, and marking an "X" on both hands of patrons aged 18-20, identifying that they are minors.
- c. security guards patrolling the facility on the look out for minors in possession of alcohol or minors that appear to be intoxicated.

- d. training bartenders to serve patrons ONLY when they are wearing wristbands and to report patrons that attempt to purchase an alcoholic drink that do not have a wristband.
- e. immediately escorting patrons off the premises which are in violation of any alcohol laws.
- f. training security in crowd control and expeditious implementation of exit procedures.

2) Fire safety violations:

It is our intention to address any open and any arising issues that concern fire safety and see that these issues are resolved as quickly as possible. Also, we will correct and work to adopt any recommendations posed by the Ann Arbor Fire Department and will comply with all ordinances.

In addition, our security staff will be properly trained to address exit procedures in case of an emergency, and will further enforce strict adherence to all safety and fire measures. We have already displayed exit signs on all exit doors in the facility. It is important to note that the previous complaint regarding the block of wood which served to keep the back door closed will only be used to block opening of the back door after the close of business hours.

3) Plans for occupancy & use of space:

It is our intention to close on Sundays. We will further do anything in our power to curtail any loud noise that stems from the parking structure.

4) Staffing:

It is our intention to request that two Ann Arbor City Police Officers oversee our security measures on every night that we are in operation. In addition, we will further employ a certified security service, which will be in uniform and present during hours of operation to deter any inappropriate or disruptive conduct.

5) Training and management techniques/ Addressing M.L.C.C. violations:
All personnel will be trained in every respect of their responsibilities and will comply with all rules and regulations.

Key personnel will receive TAM training. Management, security, and bar personnel will all work in unison to assure that the establishment meets the utmost standards of operation.

It is our intention to be in full compliance with the liquor laws of this state, as such, we will utilize aggressive checking of and verifying of IDs at the door. In addition, patrons aged 21 and over will wear a visible wristband to be worn at all times while in the facility. The patrons under of the age of 21, but at least 18 years old, will be marked with a visible X on both hands. Our bartenders will pay full attention to the wrists of all patrons approaching the bar and will not serve any

patron not wearing a wristband identifying that they are at least 21 years of age.

Any patron who attempts to purchase an alcoholic drink from the bartender not wearing the wristband, will be refused, and will be further alerted to security and that patron will be asked to leave.

Moreover, our establishment has a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY IN CASES OF UNDERAGE DRINKING. As such, the security staff will be on the look out for any patrons under the age of 21 who are visibly holding an alcoholic drink or are displaying intoxicated behavior. Such patrons will be immediately asked to leave. Our security and staff will employ crowd control tactics by slowing down the music twenty minutes before closing, ending the night ten minutes before close, working to quickly disperse crowds at the close of the business hours, and curtail any inappropriate behavior both inside and outside of the facility.

In addition to the above plan of action, V.R. Entertainment intends to abide by all regulations, laws, and guidelines set forth by the M.L.C.C. for the State of Michigan, the federal government, and the City of Ann Arbor. To further reiterate, we will abide by all the requirements of the initial agreement including closing the facility on Thanksgiving weekend as agreed upon, and will strive to become an integral member of the Ann Arbor business community.

Over the past 6 or 8 months I have been working with staff to bring a change to the city's graffiti ordinance, (see attachment) which would require property owners to clean graffiti off of buildings in a timely manner. The initiative for this change came from property owners and merchants who have noticed a severe uptick in graffiti just over the past year, and who recognize it's negative effect on the perception of our city. This ordinance is similar to our current clean communities program, in that it recognizes the importance of timely clean up as a way to deter the proliferation of such vandalism. We have worked out a lot of the details of enforcement and recognition, but we also know that this will be reviewed and re-tooled if necessary some time after implementation. We hope to bring this to Council for first reading at the first meeting in December, and we are looking to begin enforcement perhaps 90 days after publication, to give time for education efforts and to wait until the weather is better for cleaning off buildings. (I believe the length of time is left blank in this draft.)
